Composition

• Members

The Council shall be composed of one representative per member State, designated by the Government of that State from among officials of the highest possible rank in the field of prison administrations, probation services and of juvenile justice agencies, with thorough knowledge of penological questions.

The PC-CP Working Group shall be composed of nine members, elected in their personal capacity for a period of four years, with the following desirable qualifications: high-level representatives of prison administrations, of probation services and of juvenile justice agencies, researchers or other experts having a thorough knowledge of penological questions. The PC-CP Working Group shall elect its Chair and its Vice-Chair by majority ballot among its members for a period of one year (renewable once).

The members of the PC-CP Working Group shall be elected by the CDPC at its plenary sessions from a list of candidates drawn up in accordance with the above paragraph. When electing these members, the CDPC shall take into account their qualifications and the desirability of giving preference to candidates whose professional obligations and linguistic abilities permit them to take a full and active part in the work of the Working Group. The CDPC shall also take into account the gender balance and the equal geographical distribution of elected members. No two members may be nationals of the same State. A newly elected member shall not be of the same nationality as one of the outgoing members.

The Council of Europe will bear the travel and subsistence expenses of one representative per Council of Europe member State at the plenary meeting of the PC-CP as well as the travel and subsistence expenses of the nine members of the PC-CP Working Group. Other member States may also send representatives to the meetings of the PC-CP Working Group without defrayal of expenses. Each member of the Committee shall have one vote. Where a government designates more than one member, only one of them is entitled to take part in the voting.
