Purchase of local consultancy services in the field of international judicial cooperation in criminal matters in the framework of the project



"Improving International Judicial Cooperation in Criminal Matters in Turkey"

[Contract N° FC-BH4792-ICCM-NE-2021]

The Council of Europe is currently implementing a Project on Improving International Judicial Cooperation in Criminal Matters in Turkey. In that context, it is looking for Provider(s) for the provision of consultancy services in the field of international judicial cooperation in criminal matters to be requested by the Council on an as needed basis.

### A. TENDER RULES

This tender procedure is a competitive bidding procedure. In accordance with Rule 1395 of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe on the procurement procedures of the Council of Europe¹, the Organisation shall invite to tender at least three potential providers for any purchase between €2,000 (or €5,000 for intellectual services) and €55,000 tax exclusive.

This specific tender procedure aims at concluding a **framework contract** for the provision of deliverables described in the Act of Engagement (See attached). A tender is considered valid for 120 calendar days as from the closing date for submission. The selection of tenderers will be made in the light of the criteria indicated below. All tenderers will be informed in writing of the outcome of the procedure.

The tenderer must be either a natural person, a legal person or consortium of natural and/or legal person.

Tenders shall be submitted by email only (with attachments) to the email address indicated in the table below, with the following reference in subject: Tender – Consultancy services within the ICCM project. Tenders addressed to another email address will be rejected.

The general information and contact details for this procedure are indicated on this page. You are invited to use the CoE Contact details indicated below for any question you may have. All questions shall be submitted at least 5 (five) working days before the deadline for submission of the tenders and shall be exclusively addressed to the email address indicated below with the following reference in subject: Questions - Tender for consultancy services within the ICCM project.

#### B. EXPECTED DELIVERABLES

## **Background of the Project**

The overall objective of the Project on Improving International Judicial Cooperation in Criminal Matters in Turkey is to enhance the system and capacities of Turkish authorities to accelerate judicial proceedings and conduct effective international judicial cooperation in criminal matters. The project is co-funded by the European Union and the Council of Europe, and implemented by the Council of Europe for a duration of 36 months, with a starting date of 10 December 2020. The project is implemented in cooperation with the Ministry of Justice, Directorate General for Foreign Relations and European Union Affairs (DGFREU).

The Council of Europe is looking for a maximum of 20 Provider(s) (provided enough tenders meet the criteria indicated below) in order to support the implementation of the project with a particular expertise on international judicial cooperation in criminal matters, including the following areas:

- International cooperation using mutual legal assistance (MLA);
- Informal international cooperation in criminal matters, with an emphasis on cross border organised crime, human trafficking, terrorism, financing of terrorism, money laundering, cybercrime, trafficking of narcotic drugs and asset recovery;
- Inter-agency cooperation and exchange of information in criminal cases;
- Related legislative and procedural frameworks, including relevant international instruments;
- Effective implementation of the institutional procedures;
- Formulation and execution of MLA requests;
- Extradition:
- MLA statistics and case tracking systems.

This Contract is currently estimated to cover up to 70 activities, to be held by 9 December 2023. This estimate is for information only and shall not constitute any sort of contractual commitment on the part of the Council of Europe. The Contract may potentially represent a higher or lower number of activities, depending on the evolving needs of the Organisation.

For information purposes only, the total budget of the project amounts to 3,000,000 Euros and the total amount of the object of present tender **shall not exceed 55,000 Euros tax exclusive** for the whole duration of the Framework Contract. This information does not constitute any sort of contractual commitment or obligation on the part of the Council of Europe.

#### Lots

The present tendering procedure aims to select Provider(s) to support the implementation of the project and is divided into the following lots:

Lots	Maximum number of Providers to be selected
Lot 1: Legislative and institutional framework for international judicial cooperation	10
Lot 2: Capacity building on international judicial cooperation in criminal matters	10

Lot 1 concerns review and recommendations to the legislative and institutional framework for international cooperation in criminal matters, related inter-agency cooperation as well as to the MLA, extradition and informal cooperation guidelines and templates, including the system for filtering and quality checking of requests at regional level.

Lot 2 concerns development and delivery of trainings to the judicial authorities and prosecutors on effective implementation of international cooperation in criminal matters, including MLA, extradition and informal cooperation, preparing and responding to requests for international cooperation, filtering and quality checking of requests at the regional level.

The Council will select the abovementioned number of Provider(s) per lot, provided enough tenders meet the criteria indicated below. Tenderers are invited to indicate which lot(s) they are tendering for (see Section A of the Act of Engagement).

## **Scope of the Framework Contract**

Throughout the duration of the Framework Contract, pre-selected Providers may be asked to: Under Lot 1:

- Drafting analytical reports, such as: assessments, opinions on legislative frameworks, institutional reviews, effectiveness reviews, comparative analysis, inclusive of desk work and participation in assessment meetings, where required.
- Contributing to the preparation of guidelines, standard operating procedures, templates, and other similar matters.
- Participating and contributing to events (roundtable meetings, workshops, conferences, high-level meetings, consultation meetings etc.)

#### Under Lot 2:

- Drafting analytical reports, such as: assessments, institutional reviews, effectiveness reviews, comparative analysis, inclusive of desk work and participation in assessment meetings, where required.
- Contributing to the preparation of guidelines, standard operating procedures, and other similar matters.
- Preparing training curricula, training modules and related training materials.
- Conducting trainings, acting as a mentor to trained trainers and preparing performance reports for the mentees.
- Participating and contributing to events (roundtable meetings, workshops, conferences, high-level meetings, consultation meetings etc.)

The above list is not considered exhaustive. The Council reserves the right to request deliverables not explicitly mentioned in the above list of expected services, but related to the field of expertise object of the present Framework Contract for the lot concerned.

In terms of quality requirements, the pre-selected Service Providers must ensure, inter alia, that:

- The services are provided to the highest professional/academic standard;
- Any specific instructions given by the Council whenever this is the case are followed.

If contracted by the Council of Europe, the deliverables shall be provided personally by the persons identified in the offer of the Provider whose CVs have been presented to the Council of Europe (See section E. below), in accordance with the terms as provided in the present Tender File and Act of Engagement.

In addition to the orders requested on an as needed basis, the Provider shall keep regular communication with the Council to ensure continuing exchange of information relevant to the project implementation. This involves, among others, to inform the Council as soon as it becomes aware, during the execution of the Contract, of any initiatives and/or adopted laws and regulations, policies, strategies or action plans or any other development related to the object of the Contract (see more on general obligations of the Provider in Article 3.1.2 of the Legal Conditions in the Act of Engagement).

Unless otherwise agreed with the Council, written documents produced by the Provider shall be in English (see more on requirements for written documents in Articles 3.2.2 and 3.2.3 of the Legal Conditions in the Act of Engagement).

### C. FEES

Tenderers are invited to indicate their fees, by completing and sending the table of fees, as attached in Section A to the Act of Engagement. These fees are final and not subject to review. Tenders proposing fees above the exclusion level indicated in the Table of fees will be **entirely and automatically** excluded from the tender procedure.

The Council will indicate on each Order Form (see Section D below) the global fee corresponding to each deliverable, calculated on the basis of the unit fees, as agreed by this Contract.

D. HOW WILL THIS FRAMEWORK CONTRACT WORK? (ORDERING PROCEDURE)

Once the selection procedure is completed, you will be informed accordingly. Deliverables will then be delivered on the basis of Order Forms submitted by the Council to the selected Provider (s), by post or electronically, on **an as needed basis** (there is therefore no obligation to order on the part of the Council).

### **Pooling**

For each Order, the Council will choose from the pool of pre-selected tenderers for the relevant lot the Provider who demonstrably offers best value for money for its requirement when assessed – for the Order concerned – against the criteria of:

- quality (including as appropriate: capability, expertise, past performance, availability of resources and proposed methods of undertaking the work);
- availability (including, without limitation, capacity to meet required deadlines and, where relevant, geographical location); and
- price.

Each time an Order Form is sent, the selected Provider undertakes to take all the necessary measures to send it **signed** to the Council within 2 (two) working days after its reception. If a Provider is unable to take an Order or if no reply is given on his behalf within that deadline, the Council may call on another Provider using the same criteria, and so on until a suitable Provider is contracted.

## **Providers subject to VAT**

The Provider, **if subject to VAT**, shall also send, together with each signed Form, a quote<sup>2</sup> (Pro Forma invoice) in line with the indications specified on each Order Form, and including:

- the Service Provider's name and address;
- its VAT number;
- the full list of services;
- the fee per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement), tax exclusive, the applicable VAT rate, the amount of VAT and the amount VAT inclusive.

### Signature of orders

An Order Form is considered to be legally binding when the Order, signed by the Provider, is approved by the Council, by displaying a Council's Purchase Order number on the Order, as well as by signing and stamping the Order concerned. Copy of each approved Order Form shall be sent to the Provider, to the extent possible on the day of its signature.

#### E. ASSESSMENT

Exclusion criteria and absence of conflict of interests

(by signing the Act of Engagement, you declare on your honour not being in any of the below situations)<sup>3</sup>

Tenderers shall be excluded from participating in the tender procedure if they:

- have been sentenced by final judgment on one or more of the following charges: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering, terrorist financing, terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, child labour or trafficking in human beings;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or are subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have received a judgment with res judicata force, finding an offence that affects their professional integrity or serious professional misconduct;

<sup>-</sup> A certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of incorporation indicating that the fourth criterion is met;

<sup>-</sup> For legal persons, an extract from the companies register or other official document proving ownership and control of the Tenderer;

<sup>-</sup> For natural persons (including owners and executive officers of legal persons), a scanned copy of a valid photographic proof of identity (e.g. passport).

- do not comply with their obligations as regards payment of social security contributions, taxes and dues, according to the statutory provisions of their country of incorporation, establishment or residence;
- are or are likely to be in a situation of conflict of interests;
- are or if their owner(s) or executive officer(s), in the case of legal persons, are included in the lists of
  persons or entities subject to restrictive measures applied by the European Union (available at
  www.sanctionsmap.eu).

## Eligibility criteria

- At least 7 years of experience, <u>as a natural person or the persons assigned to the execution of the contract as a legal person</u>, in one or more of the following fields related to international judicial cooperation in criminal matters: international cooperation in criminal matters, exchange of information in criminal cases, related legislative and procedural frameworks, related institutional procedures and effectiveness, international cooperation using MLA, formulation and execution of MLA requests, extradition, MLA statistics and case tracking systems;
- A Master's degree or higher in the field of law, political or social science, <u>as a natural person or</u> the persons assigned to the execution of the contract as a legal person.

### Award criteria

- Quality of the offer (80%), including:
  - Proven track record of practical achievements in the field of expertise covered by this tender <u>by</u> the persons assigned to the execution of the contract (60%);
  - Coherence and adequacy of drafting of sample deliverables produced by the persons assigned to the execution of the contract (20%).
- Financial offer (20%).

The Council reserves the right to hold interviews with eligible tenderers.

Multiple tendering is not authorised.

### F. NEGOTIATIONS

The Council reserves the right to hold negotiations with the bidders in accordance with Article 20 of Rule 1395.

# G. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED

- A completed and signed copy of the Act of Engagement<sup>4</sup> (See attached);
- A detailed CV, demonstrating clearly that the tenderer fulfils the eligibility criteria; **the legal persons** shall submit CVs of persons allocated to the execution of the contract;
- A list of all owners and executive officers, for legal persons only;
- Motivation letter demonstrating how the tenderer's knowledge and experience matches the Council
  of Europe needs stated in the call;
- At least one sample of an English text recently drafted by the tenderer; the legal persons shall submit one such sample for each person assigned to the execution of the contract;
- 3 (three) professional referees' contact details.

All documents shall be submitted in English, failure to do so will result in the exclusion of the tender.

If any of the documents listed above are missing, the Council of Europe reserves the right to reject the tender.

The Council reserves the right to reject a tender if the scanned documents <u>are of such a quality</u> that the documents cannot be read once printed.
