## **TENDER FILE / TERMS OF REFERENCE**(Competitive bidding procedure / One-off contract)

# Purchase of IT equipment and software for the National Union of Enforcement Agents of the Republic of Moldova Contract N° 30-03/2022



The Council of Europe is currently implementing the joint Project "Support to further strengthening the efficiency and quality of judicial services in the Republic of Moldova", funded by the European Union and the Council of Europe in their Partnership for Good Governance II 2019-2022 (the Project). In that context, it is looking for a Provider for the provision of IT equipment and software for the National Union of Enforcement Agents (NUEA) (See Section A of the Act of Engagement).

The NUEA will be the final recipient of the purchased equipment under the contract (Section A of the Act of Engagement).

#### A. TENDER RULES

This tender procedure is a competitive bidding procedure. In accordance with Rule 1395 of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe on the procurement procedures of the Council of Europe¹, the Organisation shall invite to tender at least three potential providers for any purchase between €2,000 (or €5,000 for intellectual services) and €55,000 tax exclusive.

This specific tender procedure aims at concluding a **one-off contract** for the provision of deliverables described in the Act of Engagement (See attached). A tender is considered valid for 120 calendar days as from the closing date for submission. The selection of tenderers will be made in the light of the criteria indicated below. All tenderers will be informed in writing of the outcome of the procedure.

The tenderer must be a legal person or consortia of legal and/or natural persons. Tenders shall be submitted by email only (with attachments) to the email address indicated in the table below, with the following reference in subject: Tender for provision of IT equipment and software for NUEA. Tenders addressed to another email address will be rejected.

The general information and contact details for this procedure are indicated on this page. You are invited to use the CoE Contact details indicated below for any question you may have. All questions shall be submitted at least 5 (FIVE) working days before the deadline for submission of the tenders and shall be exclusively addressed to the email address indicated below with the following reference in subject: Questions - Tender for provision of IT equipment and software for NUEA

#### B. EXPECTED DELIVERABLES

The expected deliverables are described in **Section A of the Act of Engagement** (See attached).

#### C FFFS

All tenderers are invited to fill in the **table of fees** as reproduced in **Section A of the Act of Engagement**.

Tenderers **subject to VAT** shall also send **a quote (Pro Forma invoice)** on their letterhead including:

- the Service Provider's name and address;
- its VAT number;
- the full list of services;
- the fee per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement), tax exclusive, the applicable VAT rate, the amount of VAT and the amount VAT inclusive.

#### D. ASSESSMENT

Exclusion criteria and absence of conflict of interests

(by signing the Act of Engagement,<sup>2</sup> you declare on your honour not being in any of the below situations) Tenderers shall be excluded from participating in the tender procedure if they:

- have been sentenced by final judgment on one or more of the following charges: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering, terrorist financing, terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, child labour or trafficking in human beings;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or are subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have received a judgment with res judicata force, finding an offence that affects their professional integrity or serious professional misconduct;
- do not comply with their obligations as regards payment of social security contributions, taxes and dues, according to the statutory provisions of their country of incorporation, establishment or residence;
- are an entity created to circumvent tax, social or other legal obligations (empty shell company), have ever created or are in the process of creation of such an entity;
- have been involved in mismanagement of the Council of Europe funds or public funds;
- are or appear to be in a situation of conflict of interest;
- are or if their owner(s) or executive officer(s), in the case of legal persons, are included in the lists of persons or entities subject to restrictive measures applied by the European Union (available at <a href="https://www.sanctionsmap.eu">www.sanctionsmap.eu</a>).

#### Eligibility criteria

- The tenderer should have carried out at least 3 (three) financial years of similar services;
- Must have a documented partnership with the manufacturer(s) of the software and hardware that it offers.

### Award criteria

- Quality of the offer against the business requirements specified in the Annex 1 of the Act of Engagement (50%);
- Financial offer (50%).

Multiple tendering is not authorised.

#### E. NEGOTIATIONS

The Council reserves the right to hold negotiations with the bidders in accordance with Article 20 of Rule 1395.

<sup>-</sup> An extract from the record of convictions or failing that an equivalent document issued by the competent judicial or administrative authority of the country of incorporation, indicating that the first three and sixth above listed exclusion criteria are met;

<sup>-</sup> A certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of incorporation indicating that the fourth criterion is met;

<sup>-</sup> For legal persons, an extract from the companies register or other official document proving ownership and control of the Tenderer;

<sup>-</sup> For natural persons (including owners and executive officers of legal persons), a scanned copy of a valid photographic proof of identity (e.g. passport).

#### F. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED

Tenderers are invited to submit:

- A completed and signed copy of the Act of Engagement<sup>3</sup> (See attached)
- For tenderers subject to VAT <u>only</u>: **a quote, describing their financial offer**, in line with the requirements of section C of the Tender File (see above);
- A list of all owners and executive officers, for legal persons only;
- · Company registration documents;
- Financial statements of the last 3 financial years:
- Technical Proposal, containing a detailed description of the specifications of the IT
  equipment/software proposed, including details of the manufacturer, information on the delivery
  time for each deliverable, the warrantee terms and confirmation of installation services of the
  equipment include. In case of International Warranties, the local authorized dealers should
  mention their service and warranty setup, details of qualified engineers, etc.;
- List of contracts with state institutions and/or private sector entities attesting previous
  experience with providing the same or similar services accompanied by names and contact
  information of references;
- Partnership agreement/certificate with the manufacturer;
- Information on proper representatives for back-up service/repair and maintenance including their names and addresses.

All documents shall be submitted in English, failure to do so will result in the exclusion of the tender.

If any of the documents listed above are missing, the Council of Europe reserves the right to reject the tender.

The Council reserves the right to reject a tender if the scanned documents <u>are of such a</u> quality that the documents cannot be read once printed.
