## The Audentia Award 2017

Strasbourg, 25.07.2017 – The Council of Europe's <u>Eurimages</u> Fund has joined forces with Locarno Festival to present the second edition of the *Audentia Award* for best female director, during the 70<sup>th</sup> edition of the Festival, which will be held from 2 to 12 August 2017.

The award, a cash prize of 30,000 euros, has been instigated by Eurimages alongside a raft of other measures to promote greater gender equality in the film industry.

Audentia – meaning "courage" or "bravery" in Latin – reflects two vital qualities for any woman wishing to pursue a career in film directing. With the *Audentia Award*, Eurimages intends to celebrate women who have had the courage to make that choice, by giving their work greater visibility and inspiring other women to follow in their footsteps.

**10 films** have been pre-selected from across all Locarno Festival's categories and all films by female directors to compete for the second edition of the Prize:

"Demain et tous les autres jours" by **Noémie Lvovsky** (France)

"Laissez bronzer les cadavres" by **Hélène Cattet** (France)

"Anatomia del miracolo" by Alessandra Celesia (France/Italy)

"Pietra tenera" by **Aurélie Mertenat** (Switzerland)

"Sand und Blut" by **Angelika Spangel** (Austria)

The prize-giver of the second edition, **Goldshifteh Farahani**, has been chosen for her outstanding courage and commitment to advancing the cause of gender equality.

Jury members include: **Rachel Schmid**, the Swiss representative to Eurimages, **Marie-Pierre Vallé** (Head of Acquisitions, Wild Bunch) and **Roger Garcia** (Executive Director of the Hong Kong International Film Festival).

The first prize-winner was Anca Damian, for her film "Magic Mountain", which won the first Audentia Award at Istanbul Film Festival in 2016.

The second *Audentia* prize recipient will be announced on **Thursday 10 August 2017** and will awarded on the Piazza Grande, Locarno, at 9.30pm.

For forthcoming editions a different international festival will be selected on a yearly basis.
