The Audentia Award 2019

STRASBOURG, 11/01/2019 – The Council of Europe's Eurimages Fund has joined forces with the Göteborg Film Festival to present the fourth edition of the *Audentia Award* for Best Female Director, during the 42nd edition of the Festival, which is being held from 25 January to 4 February 2019.

The award, a cash prize of 30 000 euros, has been instigated by Eurimages alongside a raft of other measures to promote greater gender equality in the film industry.

Audentia – meaning "courage" or "bravery" in Latin – reflects two vital qualities for any woman wishing to pursue a career in film directing. With the **Audentia Award**, Eurimages intends to celebrate women who have had the courage to make that choice, by giving their work greater visibility and inspiring other women to follow in their footsteps.
