European Heritage Days

- <u>European Heritage Days</u> positive example of collaboration with the Council of Europe.
- Most widely known participatory cultural event shared by the citizens of Europe.
- Organised very successful joint initiative of the Council of Europe and the European Union for over 21 years.
- 2018 theme Art of Sharing



FARO WAY

- The joint project enhanced participation in cultural heritage
- Launched during the European Year of Cultural Heritage 2018
- Promotes the principles of the Faro Convention of the Council of Europe.
- Encourages an increased role for communities and civil society in heritage governance, ensuring that heritage contributes to the social, cultural and economic dynamics of communities.



Cultural Heritage in Action

- Project launched in February 2020 as part of the European Framework of Action on Cultural Heritage
- **Peer-learning programme** for local and regional authorities and stakeholders.
- Focus: participatory governance of cultural heritage, re-use of cultural heritage and quality principles for interventions on cultural heritage

Cultural Heritage and Education

- **INCREAS**: connect the cultural heritage sector with cultural and creative industries and provide innovative and creative education solutions.
- <u>CHARTER</u>: identifying skills gap in the heritage sector and propose training and curricula for the development of new skills for cultural heritage professionals.
- Joint UNESCO EU project <u>"Engaging Youth for</u> an Inclusive and Sustainable Europe"
 - European Heritage Professionals Forum
 - raising awareness for and learning with intangible cultural heritage in UNESCO ASPnet schools across the European Union.



Dedicated Erasmus + Call

- <u>New call</u> in support to cultural and creative sectors in crisis through educational activities launched on 25 August 2020
- Support to skills development, digital competencies and social inclusion through arts, linking our education, training and youth stakeholders with cultural and creative sector grassroots organisations
- Budget: € 100 million
- Deadline: was 29/10

Impacts of COVID-19 on Tourism and Cultural Heritage Sector

- UNWTO: decrease of international tourism by 60-80% 2020
- 6m jobs directly associated with tourism
- 3 out of 5 museums lost an average of €20,000 a week¹
- Larger museums and museums in touristic areas: up to hundreds of thousands of Euros¹
- Digitalisation:
 - 4/5 museums increased their digital services¹
 - 2/5 museums saw an increase in online visits (between10 to 150%)¹
- Cultural Institutions and heritage sites closed/closing again – second wave



"Europe's culture: close to you" social media campaign

- Promote sustainable cultural tourism, focus on local cultural and natural heritage
- Re-discover "proximity" cultural heritage sites , incl. European Heritage Label and sites awarded with European Heritage Awards/Europa Nostra Awards
- Hashtag #EuropeForCulture
- Launched on 16 June 2020

Resets Commission's commitment to tackling climate & environmental-related challenges

- Plan to make the EU's economy sustainable
- No net emissions of greenhouse gases by 2050
- No person and no place is left behind
- Provides an <u>action plan</u>:

Boost the efficient use of resources by moving to a clean, circular economy, restore biodiversity and cut pollution

Horizon 2020 European Green Deal Call

- 17 September European Commission launched <u>the €1</u> <u>billion European Green Deal Call</u> to boost the green & digital transition.
- <u>The European Green Deal Call</u>, last & biggest Horizon 2020-funded, 8 thematic areas - open for registration until 26 January 2021.

Multiannual Financial Framework 2021 - 2027

- EU budget fit for the future supporting implementation of main EU political priorities.
- Recovery package based on Next Generation EU (NGEU), EUR 750bn available to support green and digital recovery + to support MS in tackling the economic and social consequences of the recent COVID-19 crisis.
- CE agreed on new budget of €2.2 bn for
 Creative Europe's 2021-2027 programme.
