
Aim: to measure the side effects of the pandemic on the prison populations in the Council of Europe member states

How?

- Addition of few extra questions to the simplified SPACE I questionnaire sent every spring
- 2. Two follow-up questionnaires sent in the following months




The <u>short-term</u> impact of the COVID-19 on prison populations

- The first phase of SPACE I COVID-19 project
- Comparison of the situation on 1st January 2020 to that on 15th April 2020
 - % changes that can be explained by releases related to the COVID-19 pandemic
 - COVID-19 Infections among inmates and staff
- Participation rate: 92%












The impact of COVID-19 on prison populations

Summary of findings: principal results


From 1st January to 15th April:

- Decreasing or stable prison population rates;
- More than 128,000 inmates were released in 20 member states as a preventive measure to reduce the spread of COVID-19;
- Only a few prison administrations were not affected by COVID-19 infections.
