I. Procedure for the adoption of the Council of Europe Programme and Budget

The Programme and Budget of the Council of Europe is proposed by the Secretary General and adopted by the Committee of Ministers. Since 2012 the Council of Europe has adopted a biennial Programme and Budget. As of 2022, the Programme and Budget will consist in a quadrennial Programme (Y1-Y4, *i.e.* 2022-2025) and two biennial Budgets (Y1-Y2, *i.e.* 2022-2023, and Y3-Y4, *i.e.* 2024-2025).

The Programme and Budget indicates for each financial year the General Budget of the Council of Europe (including the so-called "Ordinary Budget¹") and the budgets of the Partial and Enlarged Agreements.

The adoption of the Programme and Budget by the Committee of Ministers generally takes place by the end of November. The second-year budgets of the biennial Budgets are approved on a provisional basis.

In principle, the procedures are as follows:

In the year preceding Y1, the Committee of Ministers approves:

- \Rightarrow the programme of activities for the quadrennium Y1-Y4,
- \Rightarrow the budget for year Y1,
- \Rightarrow the <u>provisional</u> budget for year Y2.

It takes note of the budgetary implications for years Y3-Y4.

In Y1, the Committee of Ministers approves:

 \Rightarrow the budget for year Y2.

In Y2, the Committee of Ministers approves:

- ⇒ possible adjustments to the programme of activities for the quadrennium following a mid-term
- review,
- \Rightarrow the budget for year Y3,
- \Rightarrow the <u>provisional</u> budget for year Y4.

In Y3, the Committee of Ministers approves:

 \Rightarrow the budget for year Y4.

II. The Bern Convention Programme of Activities within the Council of Europe's Programme and Budget

The draft biennial Programme of Activities for the Bern Convention, to be adopted at the Standing Committee meeting, is prepared and examined by the Bureau at its September meeting and, thus, before the adoption by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe Programme and Budget in November. Therefore, the amounts presented to the Standing Committee are forecasts only and take into account both the expected provision allocated to the Bern Convention via the Ordinary Budget of the Council of Europe as well as the anticipated voluntary contributions to be provided by Contracting Parties to the Bern Convention.

¹ The Ordinary Budget is mainly funded by member States' contributions. National contributions are based on a formula, following Resolution (94)31 of the Committee of Ministers, which takes into account the population and Gross Domestic Product.

III. Bern Convention Programme of Activities for 2023

The Bern Convention functions by way of a triangular work mechanism composed of (1) monitoring of obligations, (2) standard setting and (3) assistance to Parties. All activities and initiatives implemented by the Convention are proposed by the Bureau to the Convention, adopted by the Standing Committee and implemented by the Secretariat under the coordination of the Bureau.

The main thematic pillars of the Programme of Activities and budget breakdown of the Bern Convention are as follows:

1. Statutory bodies (Standing Committee and Bureau)

Activities listed under this heading include the meetings of the statutory bodies of the Bern Convention. The Standing Committee to the Bern Convention, which is foreseen in Article 13 of the Convention, is the body composed of the representatives of Parties and Observers. It is responsible for following the application of the Convention and meets once a year. The Rules of Procedure of the Standing Committee are available in document T-PVS/Inf(2013)06.

The Bureau of the Standing Committee, which is foreseen in Rule 19 of the Rules of Procedure, takes administrative and organisational decisions between meetings of the Standing Committee. It is comprised of the Chair of the Standing Committee, the Vice-Chair, the Immediate Past Chair, and two additional Bureau members, and is assisted by the Secretariat.

2. Monitoring of obligations

2.1 Monitoring of the implementation of legal aspects

Activities implemented under heading No.2 concern mainly the only compulsory reporting under the terms of the Bern Convention - the so-called "biennial reporting". All Parties making exceptions to the provisions of the Convention, in compliance with the strict terms and conditions spelt out in Article 9 must submit their reports to the Secretariat every two years. These reports must contain a scientific assessment of the impact of such exceptions to the general obligation to protect the species and habitats covered by the Convention. The biennial reports are presented each year to the Standing Committee for examination, after being submitted under the Bern Convention Online Reporting System (ORS) tool or the Habides + tool of EU member States parties to the Convention.

Technical maintenance and updating of the ORS is listed under heading No.2.

Under this heading, the Convention also manages the "general reports" submitted by Parties every four years on the national implementation of the Convention, as well as the general reviews of the implementation of the Convention in a Contracting Party which are regularly commissioned by the Standing Committee.

2.2 Monitoring of specific sites and populations

Further, activities under heading No.2 concern the monitoring of the implementation of obligations by Parties by examination of cases dealt within the framework of the Bern Convention's case-file system and of the European Diploma for Protected Areas of the Council of Europe. They may also concern emergencies in the eventuality of a grave ecological damage as a result of a catastrophe, an accident or a conflict situation.

3. Standard setting

3.1 Conservation of species

Activities listed under heading No.3 aim at assessing the conservation status of populations of species listed in the appendices to the Convention and identifying species at risk with the aim of supporting the

development of models and tools to counteract conservation challenges, common management standards, action plans, various strategic policy documents, etc.

This work is achieved with the support of the relevant Groups of Experts and Working Groups set up under the Convention to monitor and guide the implementation of both the Treaty and the Recommendations adopted by the Standing Committee, including review of past Action Plans, Strategies and Guidance documents.

3.2 Conservation of natural habitats

Activities indicated under heading No.3 also aim at ensuring the conservation of natural habitats and the implementation of Article 4 of the Convention, as well as of Resolutions No. 1 (1989), No. 3 (1996), No. 4 (1996), No. 5 (1998), No. 6 (1998) and Recommendations No. 14 (1989), No. 15 (1989) and No. 16 (1989) of the Standing Committee. The setting-up of the Emerald Network of Areas of Special Conservation Interest (ASCI) in Europe is the main objectives of the Convention's work in this field.

4. Assistance to Contracting Parties

Activities under this heading consist of assistance to Parties in the implementation of their obligations through capacity building or trainings. Activities also include the coordination of the implementation of Action Plans, Strategic or guidance documents. Projects aiming at supporting the setting-up of the Emerald Network of Areas of Special Conservation Interest (ASCI) in Europe are also included here.

5. Education and awareness-raising

Article 3 of the Convention sets out the general obligation for each Contracting party to take action individually, with respect to the conservation of wild flora and fauna and all natural habitats in general, by for instance promoting national conservation policies as well as education and information. Through the activities planned under this heading, the Convention provides assistance to Parties in communicating on the biodiversity advantage and benefits and develops awareness-raising campaigns and materials, as well as online platforms/tools for facilitating access to information on the case-file system and on progress made in the setting-up of the Emerald Network.

6. Staff

The Bern Convention's Secretariat is charged with the overall coordination and implementation of the Programme of Activities, under the supervision and guidance of the Bureau and the Standing Committee to the Convention.

IV. Budget Year 2023

In 2023, the Council of Europe's Ordinary Budget is expected to provide an approximate amount of 244 $800 \in$ to the Bern Convention. This amount corresponds to:

- 164 800 € for financing the programme of activities including overheads;
- 80 000 € for staff and pensions, which corresponds to the position of Assistant/Junior Project Officer to the Secretariat of the Bern Convention.

The Bern Convention Special Account, which is funded solely through voluntary contributions, will be used to cover expenses that are not covered by the Ordinary Budget of the Council of Europe. Activities that lack sufficient funding through voluntary contributions will not or only partially be implemented. The amount to be provided to the Bern Convention budget via voluntary contributions amounts to $500\,589.50\,$ €. It corresponds to:

- 177 789.50 € for financing the programme of activities including overheads;
- 322 800 € for staff and pensions.
