- Expert analyses regarding implementation of Article 5 (Right to Liberty and Security), Article 6 (Right to a Fair Trial) and Article 10 (Freedom of Expression) of the European Convention on Human Rights;
- Comparative research study on relevant legislation and practices in the field of custody and pre-trial detention in selected Council of Europe Member States;
- Training workshops on methods and tools to develop, monitor and report on the implementation of National Action Plans on Human Rights;
- Peer-to-peer discussion workshops with other Council of Europe Member States having experience with the implementation of National Action Plans on Human Rights;
- Round tables and panel discussions on key substantive issues related to implementation of the Action Plan on Human Rights with respect to Article 5 (Right to Liberty and Security), Article 6 (Right to a Fair Trial) and Article 10 (Freedom of Expression) of the European Convention on Human Rights.
