- ◆ Capacity building activities, such as organisation of Help Courses for all stakeholders;
- ◆ Tailored capacity building activities for each stakeholder;
- ◆ Tailored capacity building activities for law enforcement agencies and legal professionals on human rights approach in fight against smuggling of migrants;
- ◆ Awareness raising activities, such as roundtables, workshops and coordination and exchange meetings
- ◆ Translation, publication and dissemination of materials
