We have noted increase in cases of domestic violence. Hence children suffer from abuse even more. Moreover, children spend their free time online and as a result they are more vulnerable on the Internet.

Re steps done to protect children online. Within #Stop\_sexting project we have launched our page in TikTok as there are a lot of children and we would like to protect them.

We also have chatbot in Telegram where you can get an instruction describing what to do in case of sexual abuse and can find a lot of useful information. Moreover, we developed lessons and exercises for parents and children and carry out a lot of webinars.

Within #Stop\_sexting team we will continue all of our activities after quarantine as we understand that children are vulnerable on the Internet.

Please also tell us whether and how children will be involved in decision-making on or assessing the impact of COVID-19 measures in the future.

During quarantine we have launched our special project with young people from Teenergizer (organization which connects young people from Central Europe and Central Asia). We have asked Ukrainian teens how they feel during quarantine. We also sent them our educational materials and asked them to share feedback how useful it can be.

In addition, we have also cooperated with children in developing special survey which we will launch in TikTok.
