Women & girls make up half of the population. It's a question of human rights and freedom of expression.

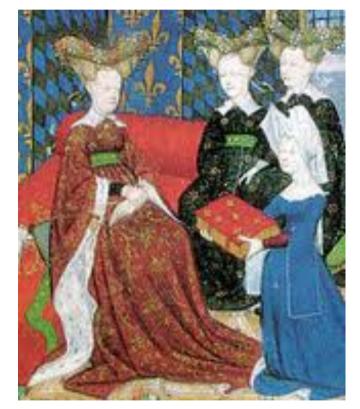
The democracy argument

Current situation

 Political shifts towards nationalistic agendas in many countries tend to hold anti-feminist themes that affects women professionally and in their privates lives.

 The technological shifts has opened for new ways of displaying hate - but this hate is also to contested.

Note: Women can also perform sexist hate speech

Example: Teenage girls sets up a page "Sluts of Gothenburg" on Instagram 2013. Caused riots at a high school and on the streets.



Court sentenced the girls aged 15 and 16 to pay £1,450 to each of 38 defamation victims

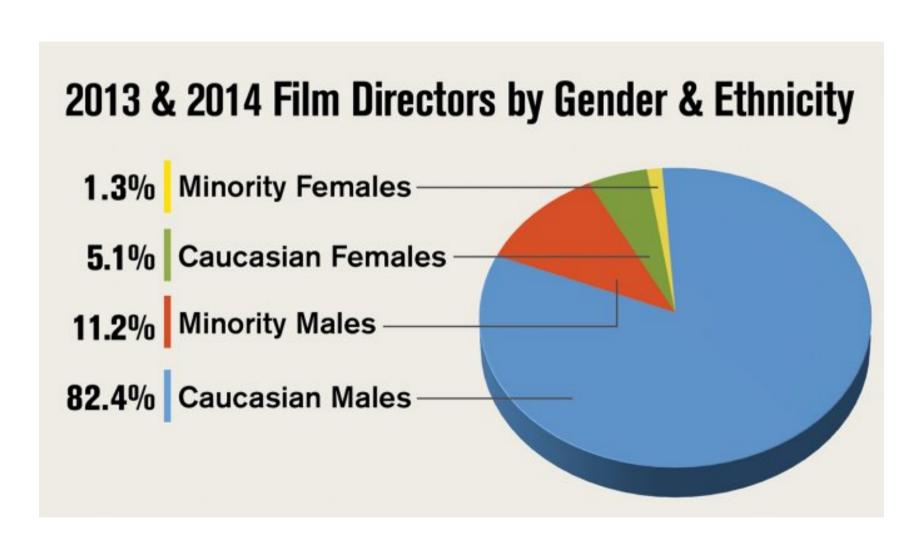

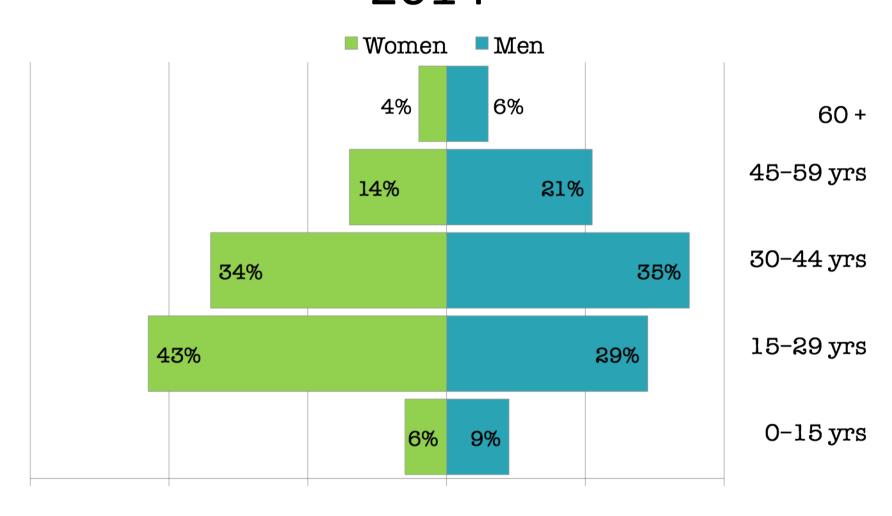

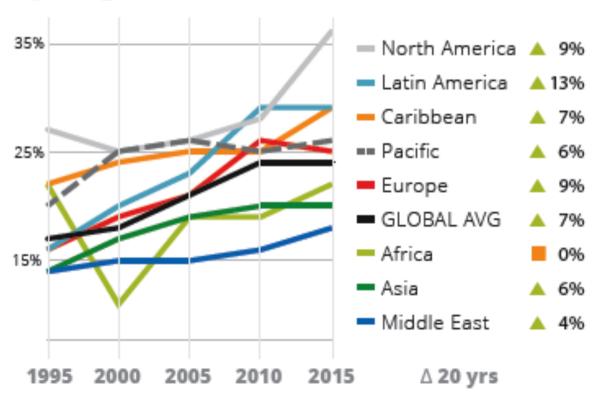

Overall presence of women 1995-2015

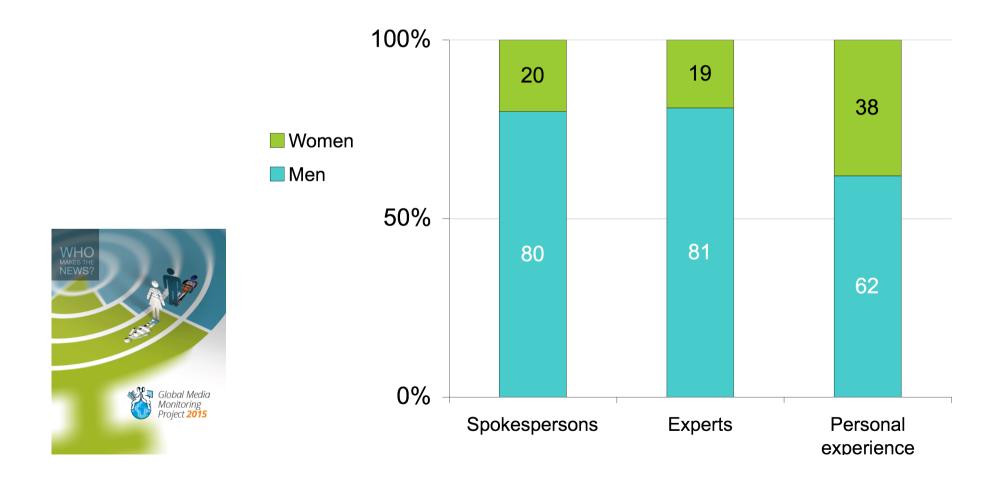
Overall presence of women in print, radio and television news, by region. 1995-2015 (see Table 11)





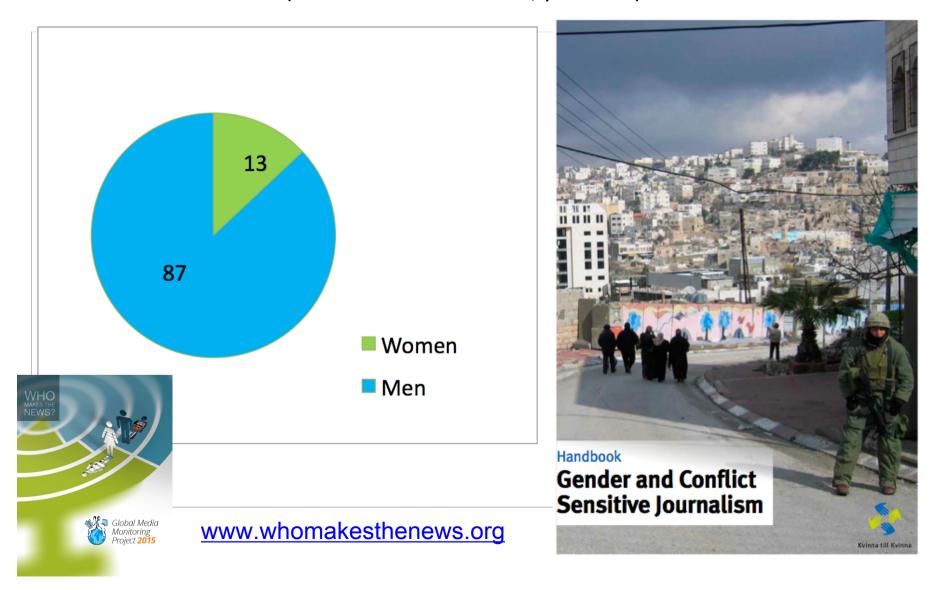
Spokespersons and experts are represented by men

Men and women in different functions. GMMP 2015 (per cent)

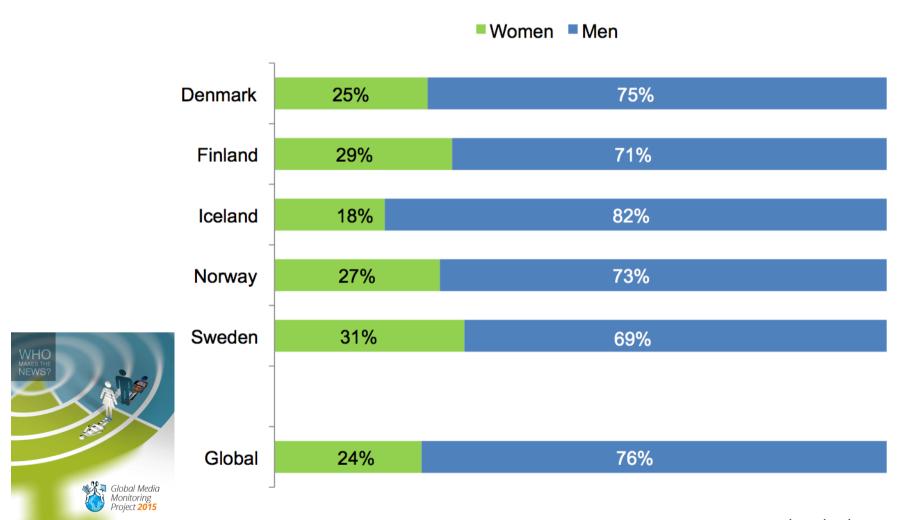


Women in the news conflict areas

Technological shifts: Hate on all platforms

New technology - old values?

Threats and cyberbullying are common Data from Sweden:

- 71 % of the tabloid journalists have recieved threats
- Columnists are more likely to receive threats.
- More men than women (35 % vs 32)
- Women receive more sexualised threats.

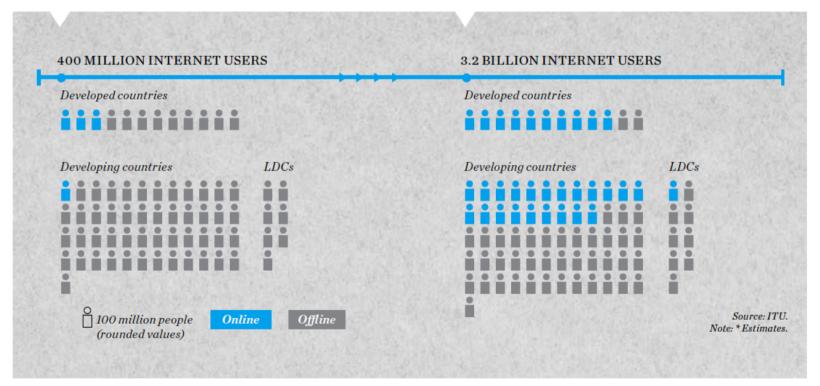


Problems

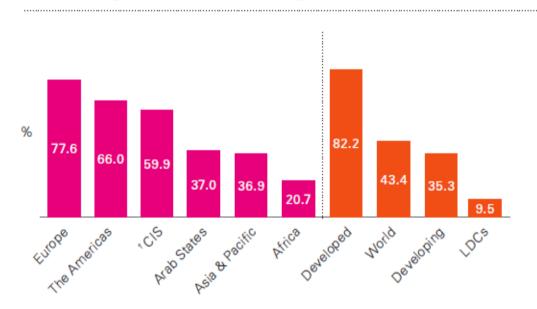
2000 2015*



- Globally 3.2 billion people are using the Internet by end 2015, of which 2 billion are from developing countries
- For every Internet user in the developed world there are 2 in the developing world
- However, 4 billion people from developing countries remain offline, representing 2/3 of the population residing in developing countries
- Of the 940 million people living in the least developed countries (LDCs), only 89 million use the Internet, corresponding to a 9.5% penetration rate

Still large differences in internet use

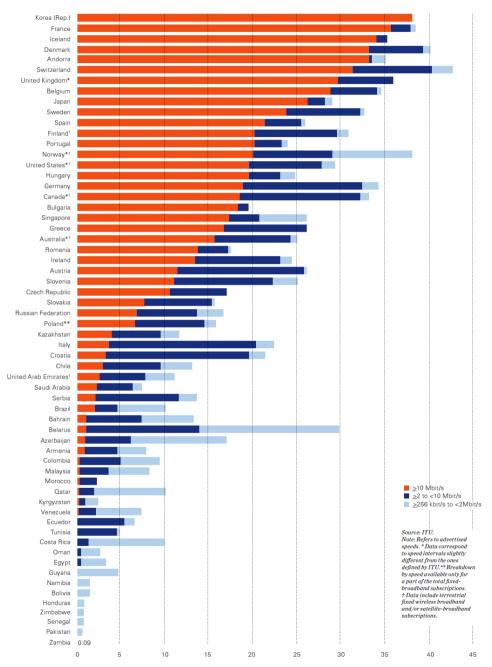
Percentage of individuals using the Internet



- Internet penetration in developing countries stands at 35%; LDCs lag behind with only 10%
- In Africa, one in 5 people use the Internet today, compared to almost 2 in 5 people in Asia & Pacific, and 3 in 5 people in the CIS

Shut up about your muslim loving opinions. Move to the ghetto and get gang-raped. You should get fucked for punishment. Then you would know what it means to let Muslims into this country.

We have seen what happens when a propaganda—spreading cockroach or a anti-Swedish pig is recognized in the street, or in a department store.

Maria Sveland, I will give you an ultimatum, you either quit job your as a journalist, life your pathetic life anonymously and make a living out of a with a 9 to 5 job, or prepare yourself for war, a life were you never feel safe. I hope this pee-soaked pussy whore drowns her self in the nearest zink.

Now is the time .. for us to have sex, I will be waiting for you outside the building. If you say no, I will cut up your body. Then, your body parts will be hung up on meat hooks. Then I will fry your breasts in butter. Yum, it will taste good. Go on, call the police. I am not afraid of the cop bastards.

Reactions & Consequences

- **Success in viewings:** 350 000 views of a 6-minute clip on youtube, one of the most viewed investigate programs that season.
- More Focus the haters (All types: young/old, professors/ unemployed, swedish/immigrants) New TV- show: *The trollhunters*
- Police follow up
 - Separating libels and threats

 One man prosecuted- harassed more than 100 women

 Trouble with anonymity
- Comments in major medias are pre-monitored
- More attention from politicians

Norwegians taking the lead

Resource centre for men reform.no

- Gathered 25 experts from the Nordic countries in 2013
- Produced a report
- Made a list of recommendations on how to counteract antifeminism and right-wing extremism:
- MEDIA has a special responsibility
- Antifeminist threats and harassment must be made illegal
- Low-threshold services for reporting threats and harassment must be established
- Annual national mapping of antifeminism must be conducted
- Research on antifeminism must be given priority
- Gender equality and antidiscrimination efforts must broaden norms of masculinity
- The gender and anti-discrimination ombudsmen should address antifeminism
- Programmes should target men and boys who experience marginalisation
- Cooperation between countries and fields must continue
- A Nordic conference on extremism and gender should be organised

Time to gender scrutinize media content

NATION For the first time gender balance in media organizations has had a central position on the agenda of the World Association of Newspapers and News Publishers (Wan-Ifra), according to chairman Tomas Brunegård. His statement is made just a few weeks after the annual conference in Washington. He believes that the next step may be to continuously visualize what content looks like from a gender perspective.

Two years ago the Global Alliance for Media and Gender (GAMAG) was formed. The initiative was taken by the UN education body UNESCO, when it became clear how little progress has been made regarding women's participation in and access to and influence over the media. Wan-Ifra is one of the 500 media organizations and groups from civil society who joined the campaign from the start and has two representatives on GAMAG's steering committee.

Walk the talk

Advice from female journalists

From the book Tackla Hatet [Tackle the hate] Rebecka Bohlin 2016

- Resistance is necessary
- Don't be silenced, but take a social media break.
- Create networks & lovebomb
- Use humor
- Talk about democratic values, respect & human rights – again and again.

Steps to take

Make sure to Follow the commitment of CEDAW and Beijing PfA Push the media issues in the global agendas of the SDG

Connect freedom of expression and gender equality. End sexualised hate speech

Elevate media and information literacy (MIL) in all parts of society – and in the future agenda. Close the digital divide.

Support research, media watch groups, gender media networks

Collect, compare and share data - otherwise you never know if there is progress.

Make sure that data and reports are **open access** and stored in digital repositories that last over time

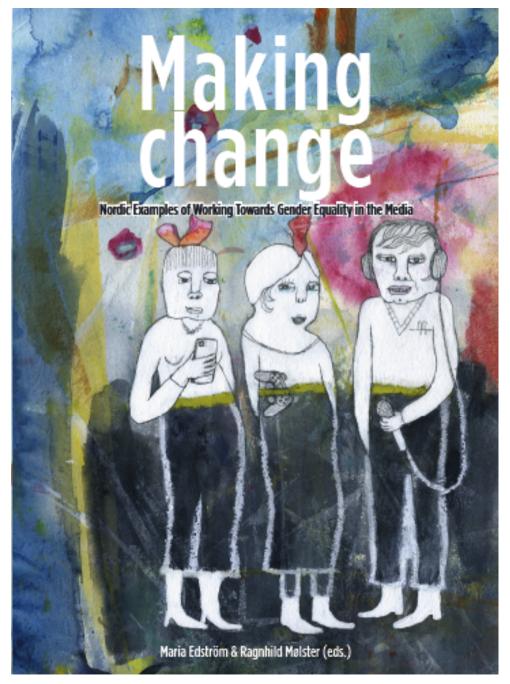

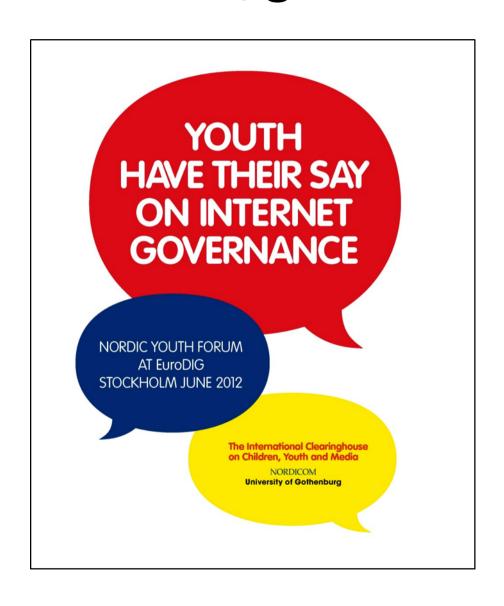
