Co-operation and the GES

- Co-operation activities and projects are contributing to the delivery of the GES
- When funding is available, technical assistance on demand is posible for member states
- Funding through voluntary contributions
- Share of resources and tools (translations, adaptations) can assist member states in delivering on GES and other commitments

Twinning methodology in the field of VAW/DV

Tool for peer exchanges in the field of VAW/DV:

- structured approached on how to develop this type of peer exchanges;
- it is focused on violence against women, domestic violence and gender equality, and uses the Istanbul Convention as the main standard for improving policy, legislation and practice in these fields; and
- it can be used as a tool for state authorities wishing to engage in peer experiences in a more autonomous way, and based on their respective institutional settings, needs and priorities.



Added Value

- Can be used regardless of ratification status of the Istanbul Convention
- Organised around 3 phases with clear steps to follow:
 - Defining scope, goal and added value (6 steps)
 - Dynamics and format of the meetings (4 steps)
 - Assessing impact and moving forward (2 steps)
- *Learning-by-doing* approach
- Practical recommendations and guidance
