CHALLENGES ADDRESSED

⇒ Space for coordination and cooperation:

Most of the youth-related entities acknowledged that the development of their own initiatives leave little margin to look beyond their own project-spectrum. As a result, most of the youth-led and youth related organisations risk to duplicate their work, to overlap initiatives, to target the same beneficiaries, to miss opportunities to innovate their programmes and, ultimately, to reduce their impact.

✓ GLOBAL YOUTH aims at increasing opportunities for cooperation and coordination among youth stakeholders in Europe, the Middle East and Africa (EMEA)

⇒ Specific competencies:

The demand for new capacity building courses is always high and it should not only address young people, but also those who work for and with them. Moreover, it was acknowledged that factors such as the methodology used, the skills of facilitators, the attendees` engagement in the preparatory process, undermine the fruitfulness of structured dialogue initiatives/consultation processes/policy development meetings between policy makers and young people.

✓ GLOBAL YOUTH will develop the skills of professionals facilitating moments of dialogue, consultation and sharing among different youth stakeholders (policy makers, researchers, youth representatives, international organisations, etc.) ensuring a high level of engagement among all the actors.

· SUMMER UNIVERSITIES:

Mediterranean University on Youth and Global Citizenship. African University on Youth and Development. University on Youth and Development.

The Summer Universities will offer platforms for networking, cooperation and exchange of good practices, integrating multilateral capacity building activities carried out by several partners from different regions, following a peer-to-peer educational approach.

JOINT PROGRAMME OF THE SUMMER UNIVERSITIES:

Participatory and multidisciplinary non-formal education activities will enable youth multipliers from EMEA to acquire knowledge, competences and tools on issues related to sustainable development, democratic participation, human rights and intercultural dialogue.

TRAININGS OF FACILITATORS:

The advanced capacity building course will create a pool of professional facilitators for youth dialogue processes and multi-stakeholder events providing expertise and support for events where young people and policy makers interact and cooperate.

· MEETINGS:

Meetings of the Network of youth and global citizenship. Meetings of Stakeholders active in the youth field. Preparatory meetings of the partners of the Universities.

A series of technical meetings gathering the main youth stakeholders active at interregional level (interregional structures, policy makers and youth representatives) will allow to set a common agenda, to identify shared priorities, to explore new synergies and to share lessons learned, advancing the global youth partnership for sustainable development, peace and global citizenship.

Youth multipliers improve their capacity to contribute to issues related to Global democratic citizenship, human rights and intercultural dialogue, being able to address challenges regarding the implementation of the UN 2030 Agenda and of the UNSCR 2250 on Youth Peace and Security.

Bottom-up multilateral cooperation among youth stakeholders on issues related to sustainable development and global democratic citizenship is enhanced through peer-learning, networking and partnership building. The North-South Centre as enlarged partial agreement of the Council of Europe has a long-standing experience in promoting dialogue at interregional level, being an instrument of the Council of Europe's neighbourhood policy.

Since 1989, the North-South Centre fosters solidarity, raises awareness about global interdependence and contributes to promote human rights, democracy and the rule of law in Europe and in other regions.

The North-South Centre is in a unique position to foster inclusive policy making processes by strengthening civil society while increasing spaces for structured dialogue with institutions in a moment where civil spaces are shrinking due to a challenging political environment.

Through the project Global Youth, the North-South Centre ensures the recognition by a wide range of youth stakeholders of the CoE values and standards as guidance tools to advance on issues related to youth participation and youth work, democracy and human rights, security and peacebuilding.

develops multilateral activities
following a participatory and bottomup approach. The project Global Youth
relies on the "Network on Youth and Global
Citizenship": a partnership gathering youthled organizations, governmental and
intergovernmental institutions.

Since 2011 the organizations part of the network join efforts for the definition of a common agenda and for the implementation of activities aiming at the recognition of youth as agents for positive change.
