Introduction

- The aim of this report is to provide a second global insight into the composition of TVOD, SVOD and FOD catalogues in the 27 member states of the European Union (hereafter EU27), looking at both film titles and TV seasons.
- The report addresses 7 research questions:
 - What is the average and median size of TVOD, SVOD and FOD catalogues, for film and TV content?
 - What are the regions of origin of unique titles in VOD catalogues?
 - What are the shares of films and TV content by region of origin in VOD catalogues?
 - On average, what is the country and service circulation of unique titles by region of origin?
 - Which players offer the greatest amount of film and TV content, and what are the shares of this content by region of origin?
 - What is the share of national and EU27 non-national works in VOD catalogues?
 - Which EU27 production countries are the main exporters of film and TV titles on VOD in the EU27?
- For film data, 169 TVOD catalogues, 673 SVOD catalogues and 129 FOD catalogues in 25 EU* countries were analysed based on JustWatch catalogue data. The data was collected in September 2022 and the titles were matched through databases with their countries of production. The consistency of data is obtained by matching each entry of each catalogue with a unique original title.
- For TV content, the analysis was based on JustWatch data from 391 SVOD catalogues and 58 FOD catalogues in 25 EU* countries and on 48 TVOD catalogues in 13 EU** countries. The data was collected in September 2022 and the TV seasons were matched through databases with their countries of production.



Methodology

- For the origin of a title, only the first country of production was considered. This approach is a proxy, as in a limited number of cases, minority coproductions can be considered as national productions under co-production agreements.
- Four regions of origin are considered: "EU27" titles have an EU27 country as first production country. "Other European" titles have as a first production country a European country that is a member of the Council of Europe, "US" titles are from the United States of America and "Other region"/"Other international" designates titles from all other origins.
- The shares included in this report are only indicative and minor identification errors might have occurred: About 1% of all titles are not identified and are not included in the statistics presented in this report.

Methodology: glossary

- TVOD (Transaction Video On Demand): services where consumers can rent or purchase a work on a title-per-title basis.
- SVOD (Subscription Video On Demand): services which propose for a monthly fee a catalogue of works available on demand.
- FOD (Free Video on Demand): services which are mostly ad-supported and free to view for viewers; this includes AVOD services and broadcaster replay services.
- VOD (Video On Demand): in the context of this report, all TVOD, SVOD and FOD services of the sample.
- Catalogue: the full list of titles made available by an SVOD, TVOD or FOD service. Each country catalogue of global services is accounted for separately.
- National catalogues: a VOD service only available in its home country in the EU.
- Multi-country catalogues: a VOD service available in 2 to 13 countries in the EU.
- Pan-European catalogues: a VOD service available in 14 or more countries in the EU.
- Generalist VOD catalogue: a VOD service offering films and/or TV series without a special focus general entertainment.
- Niche VOD catalogue: a VOD service offering films and/or TV series with a special focus, often curated (anime, horror, art house, docs).
- Film: all feature films, fiction films, documentaries or other content available in the "Film" / "Movie" section of the TVOD, SVOD and FOD catalogue are considered.
- TV content: all content classified as "TV" in TVOD, SVOD and FOD catalogues is considered.
- Unique titles: different titles present at least once in at least one catalogue. The number of presences is not considered. Titles available in TVOD, FOD and in SVOD are de-duplicated when considering all TVOD, FOD and SVOD catalogues.
- Cumulated titles: sum of presence in catalogues for each different title.
- Category of players: the main activity of the service's ultimate owner:
 - Rightsholder distributor/producer: a company exploiting rights and having adopted the direct-to-consumer model by launching a VOD service.
 - Private equity: a VOD service controlled by investment funds.
 - Pure VOD players: a company whose main/sole activity is the operation of a VOD service.
 - Film institute: a public film institute managing its own VOD service.
 - Tech: a company also present in sectors other than audiovisual (e.g., Internet services, consumer electronics, e-commerce etc.)
 - Telecom: a company whose main activity is the operation of telecommunications networks.
 - TV: a company whose main activity is broadcasting.



A – MAIN FINDINGS – FILM & TV CONTENT


Main findings – Film and TV content

This section builds on the analysis of film + TV seasons put together, on TVOD and SVOD. The samples for film and TV content being partially different, these results should be taken as indicative.



Average size of catalogues: Far more films than TV seasons, mainly on TVOD


- On average, there were more film titles than TV seasons, mainly on TVOD (5 times more).
- TV content offering was on average greater on TVOD than on SVOD and FOD.
- FOD catalogues had the lowest average number of films and TV seasons.





Median size of catalogues: Offering based, to a great extent, on film titles on TVOD


- The median film title offering was nine times greater than the TV season offering on TVOD, eight times greater on FOD but very similar on SVOD.
- TVOD services built their catalogues on film as did FOD services, while SVOD were more balanced.
- The narrower median content offering of SVOD services is also due to a large number of niche SVOD services in the sample.





Many more unique film titles than unique TV seasons available on VOD


- The offering of unique film titles was much higher than the offering of unique TV seasons, with 5.3 times more unique film titles than TV seasons on TVOD, 2.1 times more on SVOD and 3.8 times more on FOD.
- In total, SVOD services offered more unique titles than TVOD and FOD services, also due to the fact that SVOD services are more represented in the sample.



Origin by region: European works make up 32% of catalogues

- EU27 content accounts for 21% of all film titles and TV seasons found on EU27 VOD services in September 2022 while other European works account for 11%.
- US works take the lion's share with 49% of all works in VOD catalogues.

Origin of films and TV seasons found on VOD Cumulated - TVOD, SVOD and FOD








Origin by region: SVOD more European and Asian; TVOD and FOD strongly built on US works


- $^{f y}$ EU27 content accounts for 21% on TVOD, 22% on SVOD and 21% on FOD.
- European content (EU27 and other European titles) accounts for 32% on TVOD, 32% on SVOD and 28% on FOD.
- SVOD catalogues had the highest share of other international works with 27%, showing the increasing importance of productions from other world regions for SVOD services.
- Other European works are mainly works produced in the United Kingdom.





Circulation of content by region and business model: Films in more countries


- On TVOD, EU27 content circulated in fewer countries than the content from all other regions. And films from all origins circulated better than TV seasons. The highest country circulation was for US films with 8.4 countries on average, followed by other European films with 6.5 countries.
- On SVOD also, EU27 content circulated less than titles of other origins. The highest circulation was for US TV seasons and other international film titles.
- On FOD, except for US TV seasons, most TV seasons were available on average in fewer than two countries while films of all origins circulated better.





Circulation of content by region and business model: Films in more catalogues


- Films circulated in far more catalogues than TV seasons on TVOD, SVOD and FOD and this for films of all origins.
- On TVOD, other European content (incl. from the UK) showed the second-best circulation behind US works, while on SVOD US titles showed the widest catalogue circulation in catalogues.
- On FOD, US and other international films had the widest catalogue circulation.
- Except for TV seasons of US and other international regions on SVOD, TV seasons circulated far less than films in VOD catalogues.






Tech, TV and pure VOD players offer the largest amount of films and TV seasons

- On TVOD, the bulk of film titles and TV seasons (65%) was found in catalogues of tech players.
- On SVOD, pure VOD players and TV players offered 64% of all film titles and TV seasons.
- Most works available on TVOD (87%), on SVOD (84%) and on FOD (94%), were offered by TV players, tech players and pure VOD players.





More EU27 non-national films and TV seasons in catalogues than national works

- EU27 non-national content represented the largest share of EU27 content, on all three types of services but especially on SVOD where it represented 79% of the total EU27 content offering.
- A higher share of national content was present on TVOD services more eager to provide local content to their clients, and FOD catalogues operated by national broadcasters.
- The number of EU27 works available was significantly lower on FOD services while TVOD and SVOD services offered a similar amount of EU27 works (however, more SVOD services were in the sample).







EU27 non-national exported content on TVOD: French films and German TV seasons

- More than half of the exported TV content offering on TVOD was German and French.
- While the EU 4 were the top exporting countries for films on TVOD, this was not true for TV content.
- Scandinavian content (SE, DK) also achieved export success, notably TV seasons.
- French and German films also made up almost half of all exported EU27 films on TVOD.

Origin of EU 27 non-national films on TVOD




Origin of EU 27 non-national TV seasons on TVOD




EU27 non-national exported content on SVOD: Mostly EU 4

- On SVOD, the most exported content was French (27% and 24% for films and TV seasons).
- Spain, Germany and Italy complete the top EU 4 export countries for films and TV seasons on SVOD, with Spanish TV seasons and films being the second most exported works after French works, showing the rise of Spain as a production hub for SVOD players.
- Films and TV seasons from other origins included Scandinavian, Irish, Belgian, Czech, Polish and Dutch works.

Origin of EU 27 non-national TV seasons on SVOD







EU27 non-national exported content on FOD: Swedish films and German TV seasons

- On FOD, the most exported films were of Swedish origin (18 FOD catalogues out of 129 FOD catalogues are in Nordic countries) while German TV seasons were the most exported TV content.
- Behind Swedish films, EU 4 films were the most exported non-national content.
- For TV seasons, French TV seasons were the second most exported followed by Swedish and Danish TV seasons.

Origin of EU 27 non-national films on FOD




Origin of EU 27 non-national TV seasons on FOD





Generalist VOD services offer more works than niche VOD services

- On average, a generalist VOD service (Google Play, Netflix...) offers more films and TV seasons than a niche VOD service specialised in a genre of works (art house films, anime, horror, documentaries etc.) and often curated.
- In the film sample, 419 VOD catalogues were classified as generalist and 552 as niche.
- In the TV sample, 289 VOD catalogues were classified as generalist and 208 as niche.



Strong differences between national, multi-country and pan-European catalogues

- The highest average and median number of films were found in multi-country TVOD catalogues.
- The lowest average of films was found in national FOD and multi-country SVOD catalogues.
- The highest number of catalogues in the sample were pan-European SVOD catalogues (available in more than 14 EU countries) with generalist services such as Netflix, Amazon Prime Video, Apple TV+ and Disney+, and niche services such as CuriosityStream, Docsville, Hoichoi and MUBI.
- For all business models, pan-European services were the most represented in the sample, followed by multi-country services (available in 2 to 13 EU countries) and national services.





Note: Average refers to the total number of films in catalogues divided by the total number of catalogues for TVOD, FOD and SVOD services, and for multi-country, pan-European and national services, respectively. The median is calculated separately for TVOD, FOD and SVOD services, and for multi-country, pan-European and national services, respectively.



Huge disparities in the number of films for TVOD and SVOD services

- The highest number of films were found in pan-European TVOD services (iTunes IE) and multi-country TVOD services (Amazon TVOD DE).
- The disparities in the maximum and minimum number of films between the same types of services show however that some services may also have been more focused on curation of films or had an offering more focused on other types of content than films (TV content, niche content).








Extreme disparities in the size of 169 TVOD catalogues in the sample

- Average and median values do not reflect the enormous disparities in the numbers of films in each VOD catalogue.
- 40 TVOD catalogues had more than 10 000 films, 24 between 5 000 and 9 999 films, 33 between 1 000 and 4 999 films and 72 TVOD catalogues had fewer than 1 000 films (with 32 catalogues having fewer than 100 films in their catalogues).




Extreme disparities in the size of 673 SVOD catalogues

Two SVOD catalogues had more than 10 000 films, 22 between 5 000 and 9 999 films, 171 between 1 000 and 4 999 films and 478 SVOD catalogues had fewer than 1 000 films (with 135 SVOD catalogues having fewer than 100 films in their catalogues).




Fewer disparities in the size of 129 FOD catalogues

Four FOD catalogues had more than 5 000 films, 6 between 1 000 and 4 999 films, 88 between 500 and 999 films and 31 FOD catalogues had less than 500 films (with 10 FOD catalogues having less than 100 films in their catalogues).



The bulk of films available on both TVOD and SVOD were less than 10 years old while FOD had slightly older films

- More than 50% of all films available on SVOD were produced in 2013 or later and 52% were less than 10 years old in 2022.
- More than 50% of all films available on TVOD were produced in 2013 or later and 56% were less than 10 years old in 2022.
- More than 50% of all films available on FOD were produced in 2007 or later and 39% were less than 10 years old in 2022.





B.2 – Unique film titles available in VOD catalogues

On TVOD, SVOD and FOD combined, over 115 840 unique film titles were available

- EU27 unique film titles were the most represented with 36% of all unique film titles with 41 852 titles.
- US film titles followed with 38 091 titles or 33% of overall unique titles.
- Other European titles made up 10% of titles with 10 707 titles, with British titles making up 78% of all other European titles on TVOD, 73% on SVOD and 77% on FOD.

A larger choice of unique titles on TVOD

With over 77 716 titles, TVOD services had a larger film title offering than SVOD services with 72 902 titles and FOD with 23 772 titles.

A similar number of unique EU27 film titles on TVOD and SVOD services, fewer on FOD

With 37% of all unique titles being of EU27 origin, representing 28 429 unique film titles, TVOD services offered a similar choice to SVOD services' 27 198 unique EU27 film titles or 37% of all film titles available on SVOD. On FOD, 8 716 EU27 film titles were available, with a share of 36% of all film titles available on FOD.


French, German, Italian and Spanish titles made up the bulk of EU titles, both on TVOD and SVOD, and a high share of Nordic titles on FOD

- With 27% of EU27 titles, French titles were the most-found titles on TVOD, followed by German titles with 22%, Italian with 13% and Spanish with 8%.
- On SVOD, French titles represented 25% of all EU27 titles, Italian 16%, German 14% and Spanish 11%.
- On FOD, German titles made up 23% of all EU27 titles, Italian 17%, French 14% and Swedish 13%.
- Nordic films (DK, FI, SE) represented 12% of all EU27 titles on TVOD and on SVOD but 28% on FOD due to the presence of several FOD catalogues of Nordic national broadcasters.


Total number of unique film titles available in VOD catalogues

- 115 846 unique films titles were available to viewers on all three types of VOD catalogues.
- EU27 film titles made up 36% and other European film titles 9%.
- For EU27 films, French, German, Italian and Spanish titles represented 67% of all unique EU27 film titles and Nordic films (DK, FI, SE) 13%.

Origin of unique film titles in VOD catalogues by region of origin




Origin of unique EU27 film titles in VOD catalogue by country of origin

A larger choice of unique titles on TVOD


- TVOD services offered the highest number of total unique films titles, with over 77 700 titles available.
- On TVOD and SVOD services, EU27 unique film titles represented 37% of all unique titles, on FOD 36%.
- SVOD had the highest share of international film titles with 25% and the lowest share of US titles with 29%.
- FOD catalogues had the highest share of US film titles with 41%.






Differences in the origin of EU titles by business model

- Both on TVOD and SVOD, French titles were the most represented while on FOD it was German titles.
- French, German, Italian and Spanish titles represented 70% of all EU27 titles on TVOD, 66% on SVOD and 59% on FOD.
- Nordic titles (DK, FI, SE) represented 12% of all EU27 titles on TVOD and SVOD, 28% on FOD.
- For all types of catalogues, the other 15 EU production countries represented together between 4% and 6% of all unique titles.



The importance of GB titles among "other European" film titles

- British titles represented 78% on TVOD, 73% on SVOD and 77% on FOD of all other European titles available (countries part of the Council of Europe but not in the European Union).
- Turkish, Swiss and Norwegian titles were the "other European" titles most found, far behind British titles.
- FOD relied a bit more on other European production countries with 11% of titles being produced in 14 European countries while for TVOD and SVOD only 5%-6% of other European titles were produced elsewhere.



B.3 – Origin and circulation of films

21% of all films found in 169 TVOD catalogues, 26% of films found in 673 SVOD catalogues and 19% of films found in 129 FOD catalogues were of EU27 origin

- Titles from other European countries made up 11% on TVOD, 9% on SVOD and 7% on FOD; they were mainly from the United Kingdom.
- US titles made up 56% of films on TVOD, 37% on SVOD and 59% on FOD.
- Films from other regions had a much larger share on SVOD (28%) than on TVOD with 12% and FOD with 15%.

For all business models, national services offered a higher share of EU27 films than multi-country and pan-European services, more so for FOD services operated by national broadcasters

- In the 24 national TVOD catalogues, EU27 films represented 38% of all films; on 63 national SVOD services their share was 40% and on 23 national FOD services it was 57%.
- Other European films for the three types of national services made up 8% of the film offering for FOD, 9% on SVOD and 10% on TVOD, here again largely composed of films from the United Kingdom.
- US films represented 40% of all films on national TVOD services, 40% on national SVOD services and 27% on national FOD services.

EU27 films on multi-country services made up 30% of all films in 185 SVOD catalogues, 24% in 36 TVOD catalogues and 14% in 31 FOD catalogues

- Other European films accounted for 11% in multi-country TVOD, 10% in SVOD catalogues and 8% on FOD.
- US films accounted for the lion's share with 54% on multi-country TVOD catalogues, 40% on SVOD and 59% on FOD.
- Films of other regions accounted for 11% on multi-country TVOD services but 20% on multi-country SVOD catalogues, reflecting the recent evolution into the acquisition of films of more regions by global SVOD players, and 19% on FOD.

EU27 films made up 17% of all films available on pan-European TVOD services, 24% on pan-European SVOD services and 15% on pan-European FOD catalogues

- Other European films accounted for 11% in 109 pan-European TVOD catalogues, 9% in 425 pan-European SVOD catalogues and 6% in 75 pan-European FOD catalogues.
- US films represented 59% on TVOD, 36% on SVOD and 66% on FOD.
- Other international films represented 31% in the pan-European SVOD catalogues, showing the increasing internationalisation of these pan-European catalogues, while they made up only 13% in the pan-European TVOD and FOD catalogues.


On average, an EU27 film title was available in 3 countries on TVOD, 5.2 countries on SVOD and 2.2 countries on FOD

- Other European film titles were available on average in 6.5 countries on TVOD, 7.2 countries on SVOD and 3.7 countries on FOD.
- This circulation compares to 8.4 countries for US titles on TVOD, 8.4 countries on SVOD and six on FOD.
- The best circulation was for other international films on SVOD with 9.7 countries while they had an average country presence of 5.7 on TVOD and 4.3 on FOD.
- EU27 titles circulated on average in 6.6 TVOD catalogues, in 6.3 SVOD catalogues and 2.3 FOD catalogues compared to 17.9 TVOD catalogues, 11.8 SVOD catalogues and 6.5 FOD catalogues for US titles.


22% of all films in VOD catalogues were of EU27 origin

- In total, over 1.69 million films were present in the 971 VOD catalogues (TVOD, SVOD and FOD) of the sample.
- EU27 films represented 22% of all films available, while other European films accounted for 10%.
- The leading EU27 production countries were France with 28% of all EU27 films, followed by Germany with 19%, Italy with 11%, and Spain with 9%. These four countries accounted for 67% of all EU27 films. And Nordic films (DK, FI, SE) accounted for 12%.
- US films, with 49%, accounted for the lion's share of films available in VOD catalogues.

Origin of EU27 films in 971 VOD catalogues by country of origin



26% of all films on SVOD, 21% on TVOD and 19% on FOD were of EU27 origin

- EU27 films represented 21% in all TVOD catalogues, 26% in SVOD catalogues and 19% in FOD catalogues.
- Other European films represented 11% of all films on TVOD, 9% on SVOD and 7% on FOD catalogues.
- US films had the highest share in FOD catalogues with 59% of all films, followed by TVOD with 56% and SVOD with 37%.
- Films of other regions were better represented in SVOD catalogues with 28% compared to 12% in TVOD catalogues and 15% in FOD catalogues, showing the increased reliance of SVOD services on productions from around the world to complete their catalogues.









National services have the highest share of EU27 films and the lowest for US films

- National services, for TVOD, SVOD and FOD, relied more on EU27 films to cater to national audiences than multi-country and pan-European VOD services, with respectively 38%, 40% and 57% of EU27 films.
- These catalogues were complemented with other European films, bringing the share of European films to 48% for national TVOD services, 49% for national SVOD services and 65% for national FOD services (mainly operated by national broadcasters).
- The reliance on US films was also lower for national services than multi-country and pan-European services (except for pan-European SVOD catalogues), especially for FOD and to a lesser degree for TVOD.




Multi-country services rely more on US films and less on EU27 films

- Multi-country FOD and TVOD services relied more on US films than SVOD services, with a share of 59% for FOD, 54% for TVOD and 40% for SVOD.
- EU27 films represented 24% of all films on multi-country TVOD and 30 % on SVOD services but only 14% on FOD services.
- SVOD catalogues had a relatively high share of films of other international regions with 20%, compared to TVOD's 11% and FOD's 19%.
- On average, multi-country SVOD services appeared to be more diversified with regard to the origin of films in their catalogues than TVOD and FOD services, relying less on US films for their film catalogues.



Heavy reliance on international films for pan-European SVOD services

- Pan-European SVOD catalogues had the highest share of EU27 films with 24%, followed by TVOD with 17% and FOD with 15%.
- Pan-European FOD catalogues relied the most on US films with a share of 66%, followed by TVOD catalogues with 59% and SVOD catalogues with 36%.
- Other European films' share was the highest in pan-European TVOD catalogues with 11%, followed by SVOD catalogues with 9% and FOD catalogues with 6%.
- Pan-European SVOD catalogues had a high share of international films with 31%, reflecting recent developments in terms of increased content production and acquisitions by global streaming services across the globe.




Lower percentages of EU27 films explained by lower title circulation in countries

- The lower share of EU films in total compared to their share of unique films is explained by their lower circulation in countries, with an average of three countries on TVOD, 5.2 countries on SVOD and 2.2 countries on FOD.
- Other international films travelled best in SVOD catalogues.



On services, EU27 titles tend to circulate less than titles of other regions

- On average, EU27 films were present in 6.6 TVOD catalogues, 6.3 SVOD catalogues and 2.3 FOD catalogues, less than films of all other regions.
- US films also circulated best on services, followed by other European films and films of other regions for all VOD services.

B.4 - Focus on services' core business and ownership

Services owned by tech players had the highest number of films in TVOD catalogues, TV players had the highest number of films on SVOD (followed by pure VOD players) and in FOD catalogues pure VOD players had the highest number of films, followed by tech players

- 66% of all films found on TVOD were on services owned by tech companies (Apple, Microsoft, Google, Amazon), 34% of all films found on SVOD were on services owned by TV players (Viaplay, Disney, Zee, HBO Max) and 56% of all films in FOD catalogues were owned by pure VOD players (Classix, Cultpix, Filmzie).
- ▶ 27% of all films were found on SVOD services owned by pure VOD players (Netflix, FlixOlé, MUBI, Filmin, FilmoTV) and 6% on TVOD (FilmDoo, Chili, Flimmit, Spamflix, Filmin). Tech players on FOD (plex and Amazon's Freevee in Germany) accounted for 26% of all films.

The origin of films in catalogues varied according to the core business of the service owner


- On TVOD, services owned by TV players, rightsholders, pure VOD players and film institutes had the largest share of EU27 films in their catalogues, while the lowest share was found in the catalogues of tech players.
- On SVOD, services owned by pure VOD players, rightsholders and film institutes had the highest share of EU27 films.
- On FOD, services owned by TV players and rightsholders had the highest share of EU27 films.

Services owned by EU players had the highest share of EU films while services owned by global players offered the largest number of films

EU owned catalogues had on average a 26% share for TVOD, a 42% share for SVOD and a 23% share for FOD of EU27 films, while global services had a 18% share for TVOD, a 22% share for SVOD and a 9% share for FOD of EU27 films.

TVOD services operated by tech players, SVOD services owned by TV and pure players and FOD services owned by pure VOD players had the highest average number of films

Tech players on TVOD, TV and pure VOD players on SVOD, and pure VOD players and tech players on FOD accounted for the largest number of films in catalogues for each business model.



Sharp differences in the composition of catalogues by core business of service owners


- The highest share of EU27 films in catalogues was found in catalogues of film institutes and rightsholders on TVOD, film institutes and pure VOD players on SVOD, and TV players and rightsholders on FOD.
- Tech players for all three business models had the highest share of US films.





Higher share of EU27 films for EU27-owned service

- While the share of EU27 films was higher for EU-owned services for all three business models, the share of US films was similar for SVOD services, independent of the owner.
- For FOD, global services had a much higher share of US films than EU-owned services.



On FOD and SVOD, a higher average number of EU27 films for EU-owned services


- The average EU-owned FOD service offered a higher number of films overall, and a higher number of EU27 and other European films, than global-owned FOD services.
- Global services had a higher average number of other European and other international films on TVOD and SVOD.
- Global services offered on average more films on TVOD and SVOD than EU-owned services.





Generalist services had a higher average number of films

- For all three business models, services with a generalist focus had a higher number of films in their catalogues.
- For FOD services, the difference between generalist and niche services was the lowest.
- The difference in the number of films was the highest for TVOD services generalist services had on average 21 times more films than niche services.





B.5 – Composition of catalogues by national and EU27 non-national films

On TVOD, 35% of all EU27 films were of national origin, 19% on SVOD and 32% on FOD

- EU27 non-national films were the main source of EU films for all types of services.
- The share of national films was higher in the catalogues of the larger film-producing countries of the EU27.


On TVOD, SVOD and FOD, national services had a much higher share of national films than multi-country and pan-European services, which relied more on EU27 non-national films for their EU27 film offerings

- With a national film share of 58% out of EU27 films on TVOD, 57% on SVOD and 68% on FOD, national services had a higher share of national film offerings.
- For multi-country services, national films represented 33% of all EU27 films on TVOD, 23% on SVOD and 28% on FOD.
- On pan-European TVOD services, national films represented a share of 30% of EU27 films, 13% on SVOD and 4% on FOD.
- This shows that national services, for TVOD, SVOD and FOD, tended to cater to national tastes in their film offerings for EU27 film content while multi-country and pan-European services relied heavily on EU non-national films to complement their EU27 film offerings.




EU non-national films represent the majority of EU films

- On TVOD and FOD, national films had a higher share than EU27 non-national films, compared to SVOD.
- For all business models, EU27 non-national films represented the main source for EU27 films with 65% of all EU27 films on TVOD, 81% on SVOD and 68% on FOD.
- The offering of EU27 films was, on average, mainly composed of EU27 non-national films for all three types of service.



TVOD - Differences between national, multi-country and pan-European catalogues


- On TVOD, national services had more national films in their catalogues than EU non-national films.

SVOD - Differences between national, multi-country and pan-European catalogues


- On SVOD, national services had a higher share of national films in their EU27 film offering than pan-European and multi-country services, thus catering more to local tastes, with 57% of national films in their EU27 film offerings.
- On the other hand, pan-European and multi-country services offered more EU27 non-national films.
- Pan-European SVOD services skewed more notably towards EU non-national films with 87% of their EU27 film offerings composed of EU non-national films.





FOD - Differences between national, multi-country and pan-European catalogues

- On FOD, national services had a higher share than pan-European and multi-country services of national films in their EU27 film offerings.
- National FOD catalogues also offered more national films than EU27 non-national films, as these services are often operated by national broadcasters.
- Pan-European FOD catalogues on the other hand relied mainly on EU non-national films for their EU film offerings, with 96% of all European films of non-national origin.



B.6 – Focus on the export of EU27 films in the EU27, on TVOD and SVOD

- Only EU27 non-national films were considered -

French films were the most exported films on TVOD and SVOD, making up 28% and 27%, respectively, of all exported EU27 films while on FOD Swedish films were the most exported films with 21%

- German films ranked second with 20% of all exported films on TVOD, Spanish films on SVOD with 12% and French films on FOD with 18%.
- EU 4 (France, Germany, Italy and Spain) films represented 65% of all EU27 film exports on TVOD, 61% on SVOD and 54% on FOD.
- The top 10 film exporting countries represented 90% of all exported EU27 films on TVOD, 86% on SVOD and 89% on FOD.

French films were the most exported EU27 films on national and pan-European SVOD services while Spanish films led in multi-country SVOD catalogues on SVOD services; French films also led in all three types of TVOD catalogues and in national and multi-country FOD catalogues

Films from smaller EU 27 film-producing countries represented a much smaller share of EU27 film exports but when these countries' titles were exported, they circulated better on average than titles from larger producing countries


As a rule of thumb, the lower the volume of titles, the better the average country circulation.

For other European films, British films made up the bulk of films with 83% on TVOD, 77% on SVOD and 84% on FOD









- The lowest circulation was for Slovakian film titles, followed by Austrian and German ones (albeit with a high number of exported film titles)

- The median production year was 2016.5.
- Two titles were less than two years old in 2022.



Which EU27 countries exported the most films on SVOD?


- French films, by a large margin, were the most exported films on SVOD with 27% of all exported EU27 films.
- EU4 film exports accounted for 61% of all EU27 film exports, with Spanish films taking the 2nd spot as most exported films, followed by German and Italian films.
- The top 10 film exporting countries accounted for 86% of all EU27 film exports.



SVOD - Number of other European films by country of origin



- Four French films, four Italian films, four Portuguese, three Croatian films and, respectively, one German, one Austrian, one Danish, one Czech and one Belgian film made up the top 20 of EU27 films exported.







FOD - Number of other European films by country of origin



C.1 – Size of TV content catalogues

TV content in this section was analysed in terms of number of cumulated TV seasons.

TVOD catalogues were bigger than SVOD and FOD catalogues in terms of average and median number of seasons

- Catalogue size in terms of average number of TV seasons on TVOD was more than double that of SVOD catalogues, except for multi-country TVOD and SVOD catalogues, which had comparable sizes.
- SVOD catalogues were smaller than TVOD catalogues in terms of average and median number of seasons, because many smaller SVOD services were added to the analysis.
- FOD catalogues had the lowest average and median number of TV seasons.

Pan-European TVOD services had the biggest VOD catalogues in terms of average number of seasons, followed by national TVOD services

- National services have refurbished their catalogues with TV content in the past year.
- For SVOD services, there was a bigger average number of seasons on pan-European catalogues and for FOD this was the case in the catalogues of multi-country FOD services.

Huge disparities in absolute numbers of TV seasons for TVOD and SVOD services, more balanced for FOD services

- Pan-European services (both TVOD and SVOD) had a higher number of TV seasons than national and multi-country services, which appears to be a matter of scale, while for FOD, pan-European catalogues had the lowest number of TV seasons.
- SVOD services appeared more focused on TV content, and TVOD services appeared more focused on films, while for FOD it depended on the owner of the service.


The bulk of TV series' first seasons available on SVOD were less than 10 years old

- On SVOD, half of all TV series' first seasons available (33%) were produced in 2017 or later and 51% in 2016 or later and 82% were less than 10 years old in 2022.
- TV content was older on TVOD, with half of all first seasons available (49%) produced in 2011 or later and 47% less than 10 years old in 2022.
- on FOD, TV series were the oldest with 50% produced in 2009 or later and only 40% less than 10 years old in 2022.




Differences between TVOD, SVOD and FOD services in the number of TV seasons

- On average, TVOD catalogues had more TV seasons than SVOD catalogues which in turn had more TV seasons than FOD catalogues.
- The addition to the sample of many multi-country and pan-European niche SVOD services, with a lower number of TV seasons in their catalogues, resulted in a lower average and median TV-season count for SVOD catalogues.
- Pan-European FOD services had the lowest average and median number of TV seasons.




Huge disparities in absolute numbers of TV seasons for TVOD and SVOD catalogues

- Multi-country services (TVOD and SVOD) had a much higher maximum number of TV seasons than national services, which appeared to be a matter of scale, but also more than pan-European services.
- For FOD, one national service had the largest number of TV seasons but another national service also had the lowest.
- 77% of TVOD catalogues and 73% of SVOD catalogues offered fewer than 1 000 TV seasons, which no FOD catalogue offered. For FOD, 90% of catalogues had fewer than 500 TV seasons.



Disparities in the size of the 48 TVOD catalogues


- Average and median values do not reflect the enormous disparities in the numbers of TV seasons in each VOD catalogue.





- For FOD, catalogue sizes vary from one to 830 TV seasons.
- Six catalogues had more than 500 TV seasons, 16 catalogues between 100 and 500 TV seasons and 36 FOD catalogues had fewer than 100 TV seasons.



The bulk of TV series' first seasons available on SVOD were less than 10 years old

- Half of all TV-series first seasons available on SVOD (51%) were produced in 2016 or later and 82% were less than 10 years old in 2022 and 33% were less than five years old.
- TV-series first seasons on TVOD were older, with half of all first seasons available on TVOD (49%) produced in 2011 or later and 47% less than 10 years old in 2022 and 10% less than five years old.
- On FOD, TV-series first seasons were the oldest, with 50% produced in 2009 or later and 40% less than 10 years old in 2022 and 14% less than five years old.



C.2 – Unique TV seasons available in VOD catalogues

TV content in this section was analysed in terms of number of unique TV seasons (each season is counted once).

Over 43 600 unique TV seasons were available in VOD catalogues, 31% from the EU27

- of all 43 623 unique seasons, 31% were of EU27 origin and 33% of US origin.
- The bulk (81%) of EU27 TV seasons on TVOD were German (47%), French (17%) and Spanish (17%), while on SVOD, seven countries made up 81% of all unique EU27 film titles, and on FOD six countries.
- Other European seasons, with the integration of British content, represented 17% of all available titles.

A larger choice of unique seasons on SVOD, proportionately more EU27 content on TVOD and on FOD

- With over 34 707 unique TV seasons available, SVOD services offered more unique TV seasons than TVOD and FOD together.
- On TVOD services, EU27 content represented 31% of TV seasons, on SVOD 26% and 52% on FOD.
- Other European seasons, including British content, reached 19% on SVOD, 13% on TVOD and 16% on FOD.
- On SVOD services, other international seasons represented 21% while they made up only 10% on TVOD and 12% on FOD.

Differences in origin of EU27 content by business model: More balanced on SVOD and FOD, TVOD dominated by German content

On TVOD, German seasons represented almost half of the total while on SVOD Dutch unique season titles and on FOD Danish unique season titles led for EU27 TV seasons.

Dominance of British content in 'other' European TV seasons


- GB content represented 93% of all "other" European TV seasons available on SVOD, 87% on FOD and 86% on TVOD.





Unique EU27 seasons in VOD catalogue, by country of origin






With over 34 000 seasons available, SVOD services offered the highest number of unique TV seasons.

- FOD had the highest share of EU27 unique TV seasons with 52%, due to a large number of broadcasters operating FOD services, followed by TVOD with 31% and SVOD with 26%.
- SVOD had the highest share of other international TV seasons with 21%, and of other European TV seasons with 19%, and TVOD had the highest share of US TV seasons with 46%.



- Germany, France and Spain alone provided the bulk (81%) of EU27 content on TVOD while on SVOD seven countries represented 81% of unique EU27 TV seasons and on FOD six countries represented 84% of all unique EU27 TV seasons.



(*) Also partly due to the weight of German and Austrian services in the sample.

The dominance of British content in 'other European' TV seasons

- British TV content represented, respectively, 86%, 93% and 87% in TVOD, SVOD and FOD catalogues of all "other European" TV seasons available.
- Turkish, Norwegian and Swiss titles represented the other countries for TV seasons of "other European" albeit at a much lower volume.



C.3 – Origin and circulation of cumulated TV content

TV content was analysed here in terms of cumulated number of seasons (each season is counted in each catalogue where available).

ORIGIN

US TV seasons represented 51% of all cumulated TV content on VOD

14% of all cumulated TV seasons on VOD were from the EU27.

24% of cumulated TV seasons on TVOD were of EU27 origin, and 35% on FOD, but only 11% on SVOD

- The unique presence of US TV seasons (over half of all cumulated content on VOD) was multiplied, with 57% of all seasons in TVOD catalogues, 51% in SVOD catalogues and 38% in FOD catalogues.
- More TV content from other international origins (26%) than European* (23%) was in SVOD catalogues while FOD catalogues had the highest share of European TV seasons with 49%, followed by TVOD with 37%.

National VOD services represented the highest shares of EU27 TV seasons

National TVOD services had a share of 44% of EU27 TV seasons, national SVOD services 36% and national FOD services 63%.

Multi-country VOD services relied more heavily on US seasons

EU27 TV seasons represented 24% on multi-country TVOD services, 15% on multi-country FOD services and just 8% on SVOD services.

Pan-European VOD services relied more heavily on US seasons

- US TV seasons represented a share of 65% on pan-European TVOD services, 52% on pan-European SVOD services and 99% on the only pan-European FOD service in the sample.
- Pan-European SVOD services had the highest share of international TV seasons with 29%.



C.3 – Origin and circulation of cumulated TV content

TV content was analysed here in terms of cumulated number of seasons (each season is counted in each catalogue where available).

CIRCULATION

EU27 TV seasons circulated in a smaller number of countries than those of other origins

- 31% of EU27 unique TV seasons represented only 24% of all cumulated content on TVOD, while on SVOD, 26% of EU27 unique TV content represented just 11% of cumulated and on FOD, 52% of unique EU27 TV seasons represented 35% of cumulated TV seasons. This is explained by the lower circulation of EU27 content than content of other origins, with an average of three countries on SVOD, 1.7 on TVOD and 1.1 on FOD.
- US and other international TV seasons travelled best, crossing borders more easily than European content.

In terms of number of catalogues, EU27 TV content circulated slightly better on SVOD and TVOD, but not on FOD


- On average, EU27 TV seasons were present in 3.3 different SVOD catalogues, in 2.8 TVOD catalogues and in 1.1 FOD catalogues.
- On SVOD, other international TV seasons circulated, on average, in 9.5 catalogues.
- US TV content circulated best also in terms of average number of catalogues, most significantly on SVOD (with 11.2 services), followed by TVOD with 4.4 catalogues and FOD with 3.1 catalogues.




More than 324 000 TV seasons available in the 497 VOD catalogues

- 324 646 cumulated TV seasons were available to EU customers in 497 catalogues (TVOD, SVOD and FOD).
- 14% of all seasons were of EU27 origin and 12% of other European origin (mostly GB), compared to 51% of US origin and 23% of other international origin.
- EU4: German (27%), French (19%), Spanish (13%) and Italian (7%) seasons represented 66% of cumulated EU27 seasons.
- TV seasons from the top 10 countries accounted for 93% of all EU27 TV seasons, with Nordic TV seasons accounting for 16% of all available EU27 TV seasons in the 497 VOD catalogues.

Origin of TV seasons in 497 VOD catalogues by region of origin




EU27 TV seasons in 497 VOD catalogues by country of origin





Large share of EU27 TV seasons on FOD, small share on SVOD


- On FOD, EU27 TV seasons represented 35% of all available TV seasons, with other European TV seasons accounting for 14%, bringing the share of European TV seasons to just under 50%.
- On TVOD, EU27 TV seasons accounted for 24% of all TV seasons and other European TV seasons for 13%, with the lion's share for US TV seasons with 57%.
- On SVOD, US and other international TV seasons accounted for 77% of all available TV seasons, with EU27 TV seasons accounting for only 11% and other European TV seasons for 12%.
- FOD catalogues' high share of European TV seasons can be explained by the presence of several national broadcasters' catalogues while the low share of European TV seasons on SVOD reflects the increasing availability of many niche SVOD catalogues available to EU viewers and the increasing presence of other international TV seasons in pan-European SVOD catalogues.

National VOD catalogues – a share of 49% and more for European TV seasons

- EU27 and other European TV seasons represented more than 80% of all TV seasons available in national FOD catalogues with national broadcasters making European TV seasons broadcasted on their linear channels available on their replay services.
- On TVOD, European TV seasons accounted for 58% and in national SVOD catalogues for 49%.
- National VOD catalogues relied less on other international TV seasons and US TV seasons for their TV content.








... while multi-country VOD services relied more heavily on US TV seasons


- EU27 TV seasons represented 24% on multi-country TVOD services, 15% on FOD services and just 8% on SVOD services.
- US TV seasons made up 56% of all TV seasons on offer on TVOD, 50% on SVOD and 46% on FOD.

- FOD and SVOD relied more on other international TV seasons than TVOD for their TV-season offerings, with a share of 22% and 25% of international TV seasons for SVOD and FOD, respectively.


- Pan-European VOD services relied more heavily on US-origin series than national and multi-country catalogues, with more than 50% of all TV seasons for all three business models of US origin.
- For FOD catalogues, only one service (Classix) fell into this category, with 77 TV seasons in each of its 25 catalogues (and one with only seven), mainly composed of older US TV shows.
- Pan-European SVOD services relied more on other international TV seasons (29%) than on European TV seasons (19%) while TVOD skewed heavily towards US TV seasons (65%), completed with European TV seasons (29%).






Less circulation for EU27 TV seasons in countries than works of other origins

- For all three business models, EU27 TV seasons and other European TV seasons (except on TVOD) circulated on average less than TV seasons of other international and US origins.
- On SVOD, US and other international TV seasons circulated best with an average presence in 9.8 and 9 countries, respectively, boosted by their presence in several multi-country and pan-European catalogues.
- On FOD, the low circulation is explained by the low number of FOD services operating in several countries (only Pluto TV, Classixs and VixTV are available in more than three countries) and individual catalogues of broadcasters and national players in their home country.









C.4 – Focus on services' core business and ownership

82% of all TV seasons on TVOD were found in the catalogues of TV and tech players, on SVOD TV pure VOD players had a share of 73% of all TV seasons, and on FOD TV players had 80% of all TV seasons.

- Tech players (Amazon, Google, iTunes, Microsoft) provided 40% of all cumulated TV content on TVOD and TV players (SF Anytime, Maxdome, Canal VOD, Atresplayer) 42%.
- 31% of content on SVOD was found on pure VOD players (Netflix, Flixolé, Wakanim) and 42% of TV content in the catalogues of TV players (Disney+, Discovery+, Viaplay, HBO Max).
- 80% of TV seasons on FOD were in the catalogues of TV players (RAI, YLE, DRDK, SVT, FranceTV, Pluto TV, Sixplay).

Sharp differences in the composition of catalogues by core business of service owners


- Services owned by rightsholders (distributors/producers) on TVOD, private equity on SVOD and rightsholders on FOD had the highest share of EU27 TV seasons.
- For SVOD, pure VOD players (Netflix) built their catalogues on US and other international TV seasons.
- The highest share of US seasons was found in TVOD services operated by pure VOD players and tech players (Amazon), on SVOD on telecom players, and on FOD services owned by pure VOD players.

Higher share of EU27 TV content for EU27-owned services

- The share of EU27 TV seasons in the catalogues of EU-owned services was higher, with 30% on TVOD, 33% on SVOD and 65% on FOD, while global services had an EU27-TV-season share of 22% on TVOD, 9% on SVOD and 9% on FOD.
- SVOD global services showed a higher share of other international content (28%) than European content (20%).


TV players provide the highest share of TV seasons available for all 3 business models


Sharp differences in the composition of catalogues by core business of service owners

- On TVOD services owned by distributors, pure VOD players and telecom had the highest share of EU27 TV seasons, while on SVOD, private equity players and pure VOD players had the largest amount of EU27 TV content.
- On FOD, rightsholders and TV catalogues had the highest share of EU27 TV seasons.
- For SVOD, pure VOD players built their catalogues on US and other international TV seasons.
- The highest share of US seasons was found on TVOD services operated by tech players, on SVOD services operated by telecommunications players and on FOD in catalogues of pure VOD players.



On TVOD, SVOD and FOD, higher share of European TV seasons for EU-owned services

- The share of EU27 TV seasons in TVOD, SVOD and FOD catalogues of EU-owned services was higher than in those of global services, with 30% on EU-owned TVOD services, 33% on EU-owned SVOD services and 65% on EU-owned FOD services.
- Global SVOD services had the highest share of other international TV seasons with 28%, and only 9% of EU27 TV seasons.
- The share of US TV seasons was the highest on global FOD services, followed by global TVOD services, EU-owned TVOD services and global SVOD services.



More TV seasons on global TVOD and SVOD services and EU-owned FOD services

- Global-owned TVOD services offered on average more TV content in their catalogues and also more European (EU27 and other European) TV seasons than EU-owned services.
- EU-owned SVOD services offered a higher average number of EU27 and other European TV seasons than globally owned SVOD services and much less other international TV-season content.
- EU-owned FOD services offered on average a larger number of European TV seasons than global services.



General entertainment VOD services offer many more TV seasons than niche services

- As for films, general entertainment-focused VOD services for all three business models offered more TV seasons than niche VOD services.
- While generalist and niche TVOD and SVOD services offered on average a comparable number of TV seasons, this was not true for FOD services, both generalist and niche, which offered on average a significantly lower number of TV seasons than TVOD and SVOD services.





C.5 - Composition of catalogues by national and EU27 non-national TV content

TV content in this section was analysed in terms of cumulated number of seasons.

National TV seasons on TVOD and FOD vs. EU27 non-national content on SVOD

- 57% of EU27 TV seasons in TVOD catalogues were national TV seasons and for FOD catalogues even 79%.
- By contrast, EU27 non-national TV seasons represented 70% of the total EU27 offering on SVOD. For some global services (Netflix, Amazon) the worldwide rights acquisition of content made European content available in all their European catalogues.

National TV-season offering was significant on pan-European as well as on national TVOD services

On TVOD, pan-European services showed a higher share (76%) of national TV seasons than national services (74%) in their EU27 content offerings while multi-country TVOD services relied more on non-national TV seasons with 62% of EU27 TV seasons of non-national origin.

National SVOD services strongly built their offerings on national TV seasons instead of on non-national content

- On SVOD, national services relied significantly on national TV content for their EU27 offerings with 77% of EU27 TV seasons national.
- EU27 non-national content represented 65% of the EU27 offerings on multi-country SVOD services and 89% on pan-European SVOD services.


National and multi-country FOD services strongly built their offerings on national TV seasons instead of on non-national content

- On FOD, national services relied significantly on national TV content for their EU27 offerings with 83% of EU27 TV seasons national and on multi-country services 55%.
- There were no EU27 TV seasons in the only pan-European FOD service of the sample (Classix).

- EU27 TV content on TVOD catalogues was mainly national TV seasons (60%).
- By contrast, EU non-national TV seasons represented two thirds (67%) of the contents on SVOD, fuelled by global services' strategy of acquiring EU27 content to make it available in all covered countries.














C.6 – Focus on export of European TV content in EU27, on TVOD and SVOD

TV content was analysed in terms of the cumulated number of EU27 non-national seasons.

On TVOD services, German & French TV seasons dominated the export of EU27 TV content (with 56% of all exported TV seasons)

- Followed by TV seasons from Sweden, Italy, Austria, Denmark and Ireland.
- British TV seasons dominated the export of other European TV content on TVOD services with 89% of the total.

On SVOD, France and Spain were the top EU27 TV content exporters (with 43% of exported TV seasons)

- The EU4 (France, Germany, Spain and Italy) provided 68% of all EU27 TV seasons exported on SVOD.
- As for TVOD, British TV seasons made up the lion's share of other European seasons on SVOD with 92% of the total.

On FOD, France and Germany appeared as the top EU27 TV content exporters (with 52% of exported TV seasons)

- The EU4 (France, Germany, Spain and Italy) provided 63% of all EU27 TV seasons exported on SVOD.
- Nordic TV seasons accounted for 23% of all exported EU27 TV seasons on FOD.
- As for TVOD, British TV seasons made up the lion's share of other European seasons on SVOD with 92% of the total.

Better export rates and country reach on SVOD than on TVOD and FOD


- ullet Ireland and Italy provided 14 TV seasons out of the top 20 exported seasons on TVOD.
- Eight French and six Irish fiction TV seasons were present in the top 20 exports on SVOD.
- On FOD, six French, four Danish and two Swedish TV seasons figured in the top 20.



TVOD - Number of EU27 TV seasons exported outside of their national market by country of origin














EU4 TV seasons accounted for 68% of all exported EU27 TV seasons on SVOD

- French, Spanish, German and Italian TV seasons alone made up the lion's share of exported TV seasons.
- The top 10 exporting countries accounted for 94% of all exported TV seasons.
- 25 EU27 countries saw their TV seasons exported to at least one other EU27 country, except MT and SI.
- The increased share of Spanish TV seasons reflects also the emergence of Spain as a production hub for global streaming services (last year only 12% of exported TV seasons).

SVOD - Number of EU27 TV seasons exported outside of their national market by country of origin








Export of EU27 TV seasons in 226 pan-European SVOD catalogues





SVOD - other European TV seasons by country of origin







FOD - Number of EU27 TV seasons exported outside of their national market by country of origin








Export of EU27 TV seasons in 19 multi-country FOD catalogues



FOD - other European TV seasons by country of origin





- On average, exported TV seasons from all EU27 countries were available in fewer than two countries.
- Seven countries exported only a small number of TV seasons to only one other country.
- And even for the best-circulating TV seasons, Irish TV seasons, the average number of export countries was only 1.5.
- This was due to the low number of catalogues beyond three countries, as opposed to SVOD catalogues.

Top 20 EU27 exported TV seasons on SVOD services: Irish fiction and Danish animation ruled

- Six French TV seasons, five Spanish, four Danish, two Swedish, two German and one Danish season made up the top 20 for exported TV seasons in FOD catalogues.
- The top 20 had a median year of production of 2012, reflecting the same findings as for films: that FOD catalogues tend to contain older works.
- Only two co-productions were in the top 20 list, albeit ranking as number 1 and 2.
