CONSEQUENCES

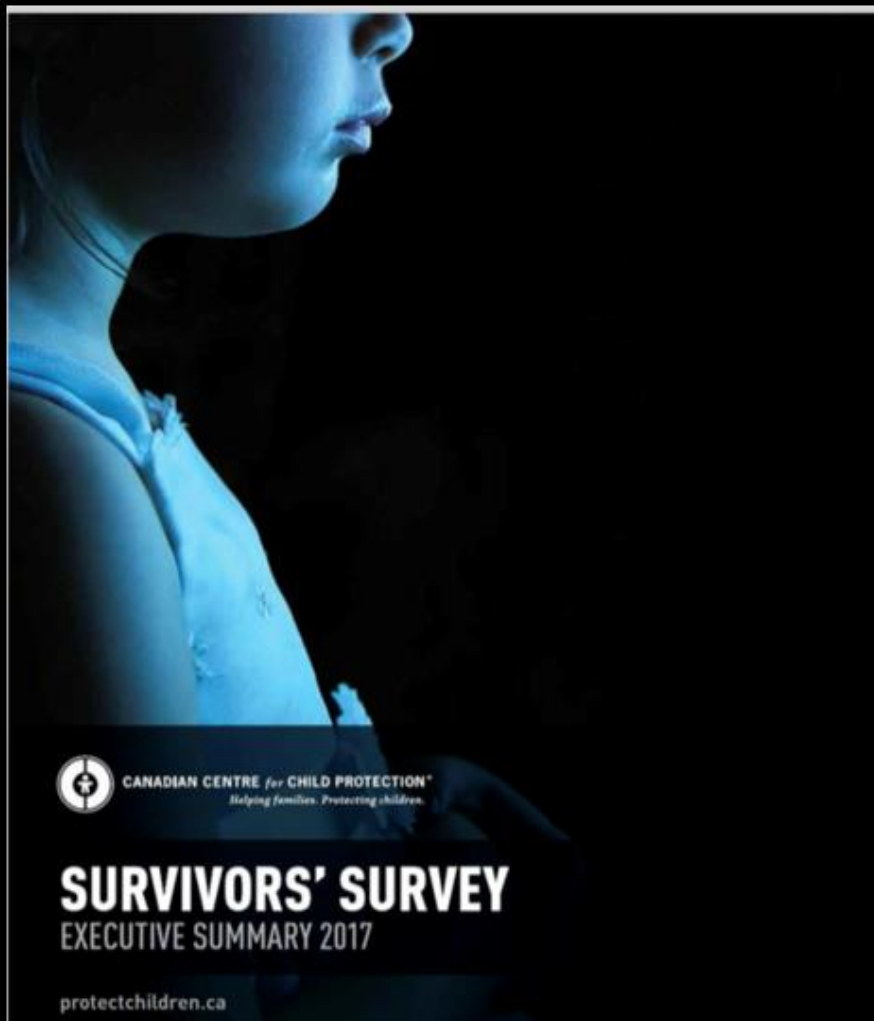
"Now the whole school has seen it [nude] so I get called a lot of words and don't go to school anymore. I can't even go to town without someone yelling things at me."

(Girl, 14)

"I was 12 and he was 18. I reported it to the police several times, but the investigation was dropped. That was about 4 years ago and he's still sending them around. I need help, but I don't know where to turn. After 5 police reports, I gave up." (Girl, 16)

CONSEQUENCES

”There are many accounts on social media where people share other people’s nudes but almost noone is doing anything about it” (Girl, 15)



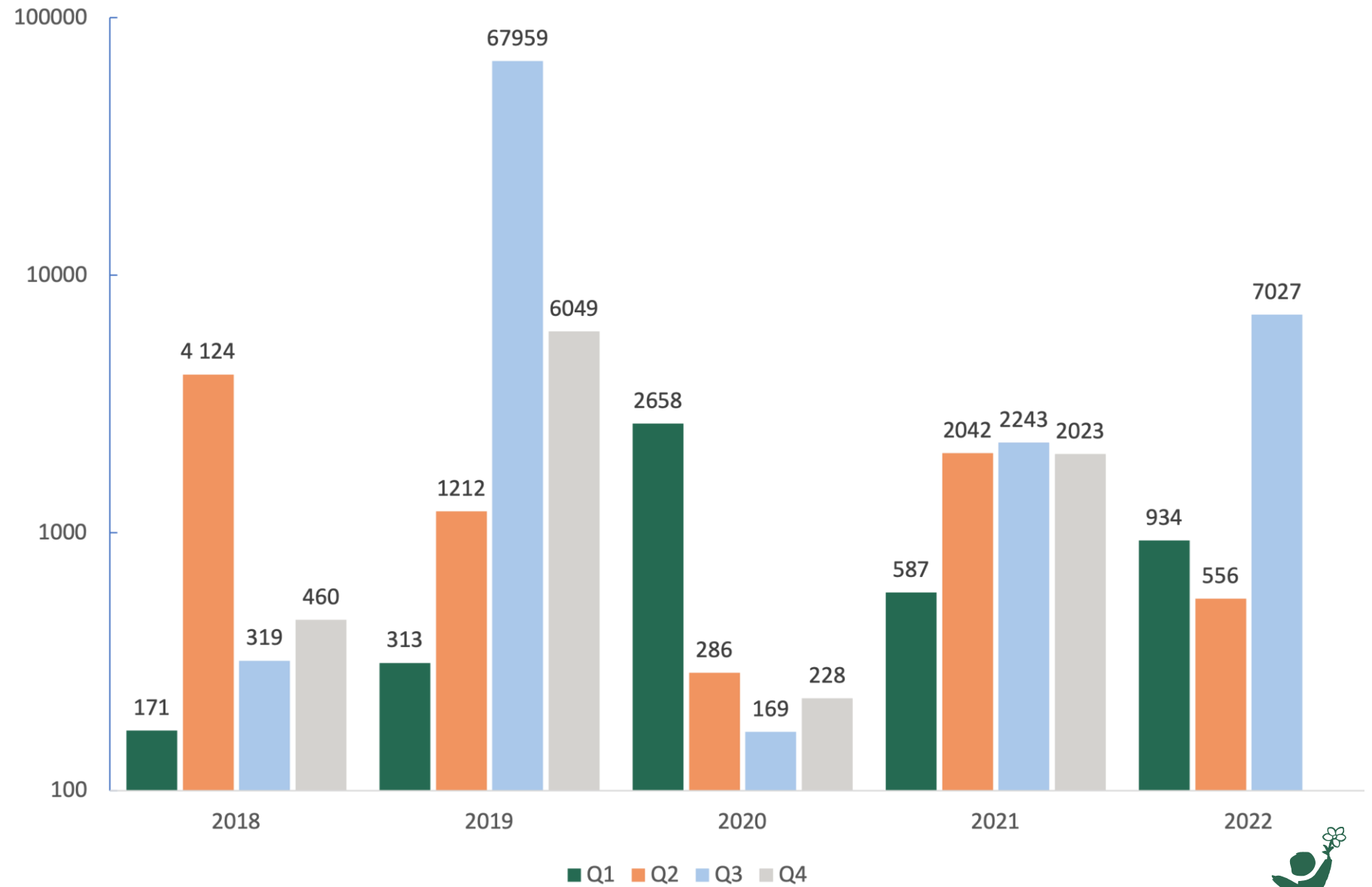
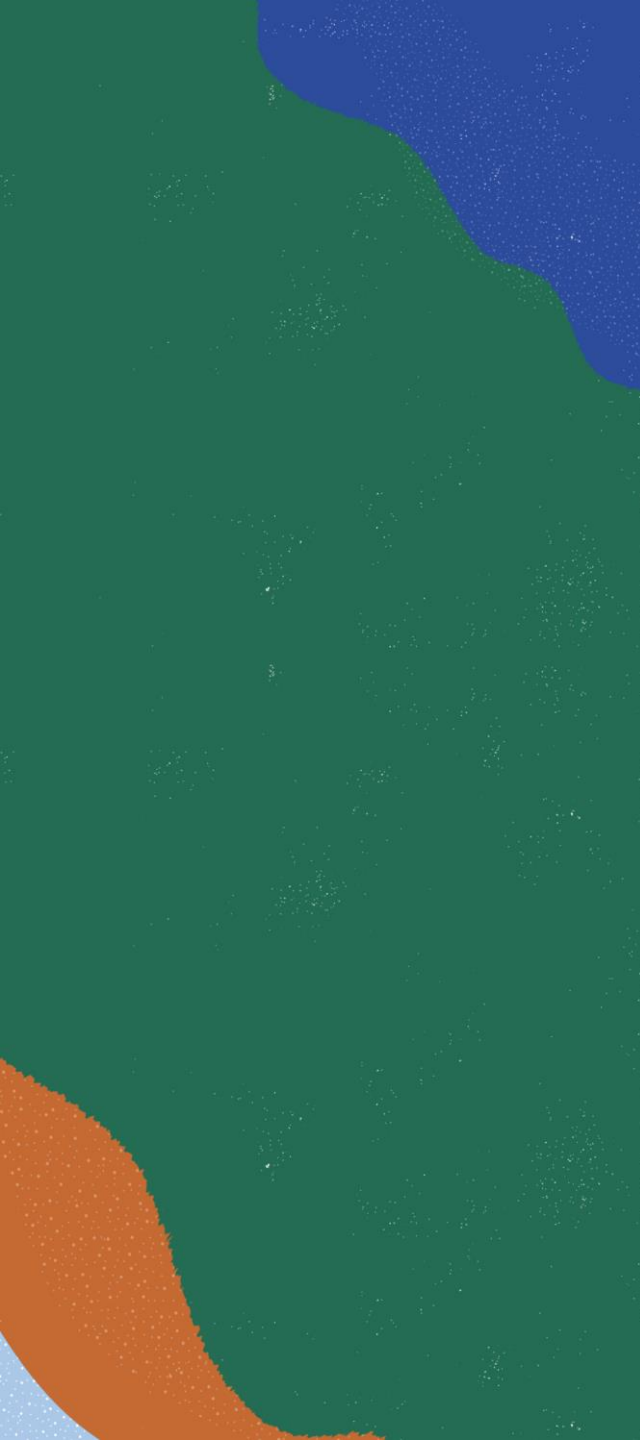
International Survivors' Survey

Goal: to understand the impacts of this crime, and to determine what policy, legislative and therapeutic changes are required to respond to the needs of these victims

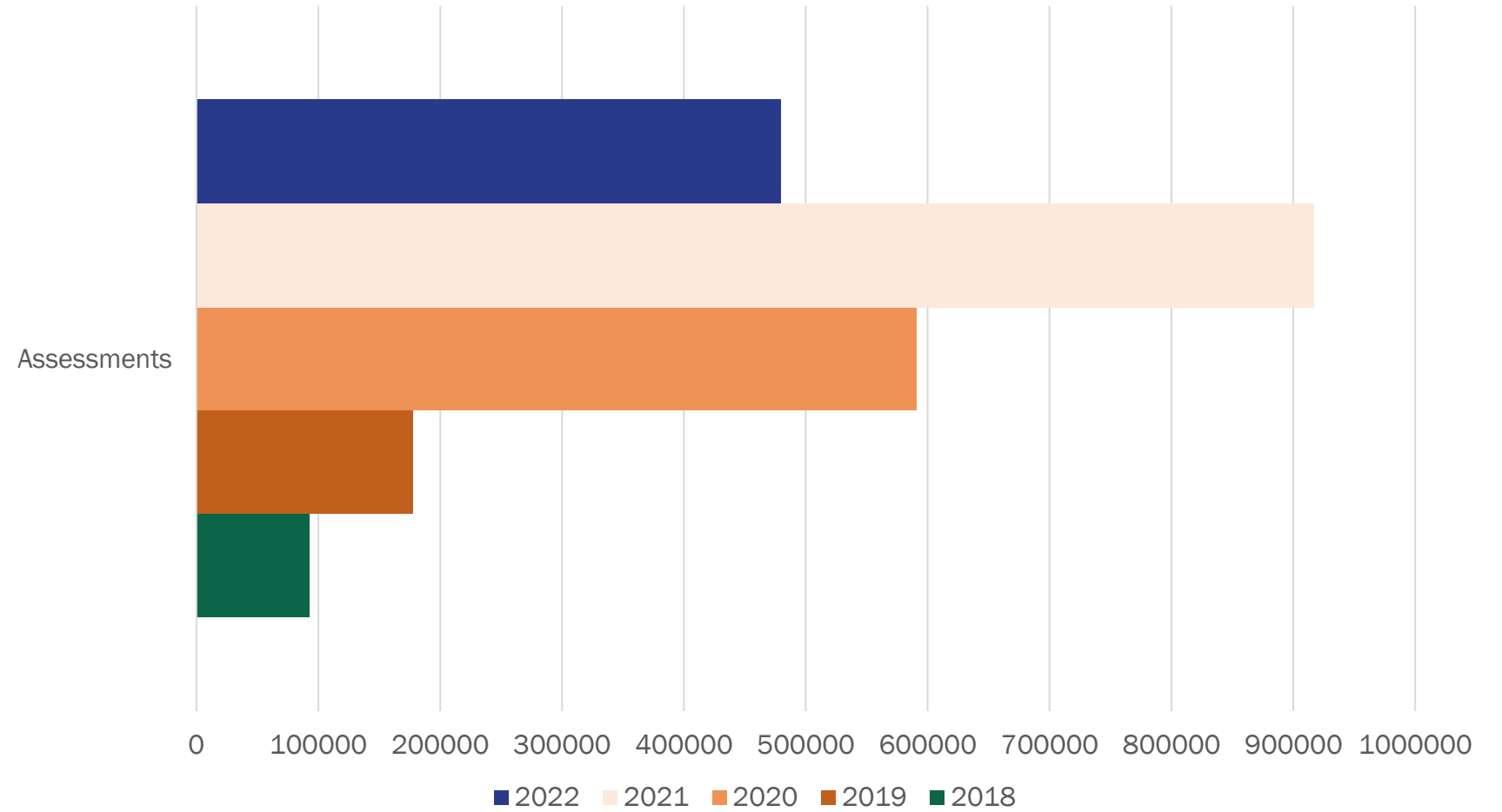
Demographics

- Countries: Netherland, Germany, United States, UK, Canada,

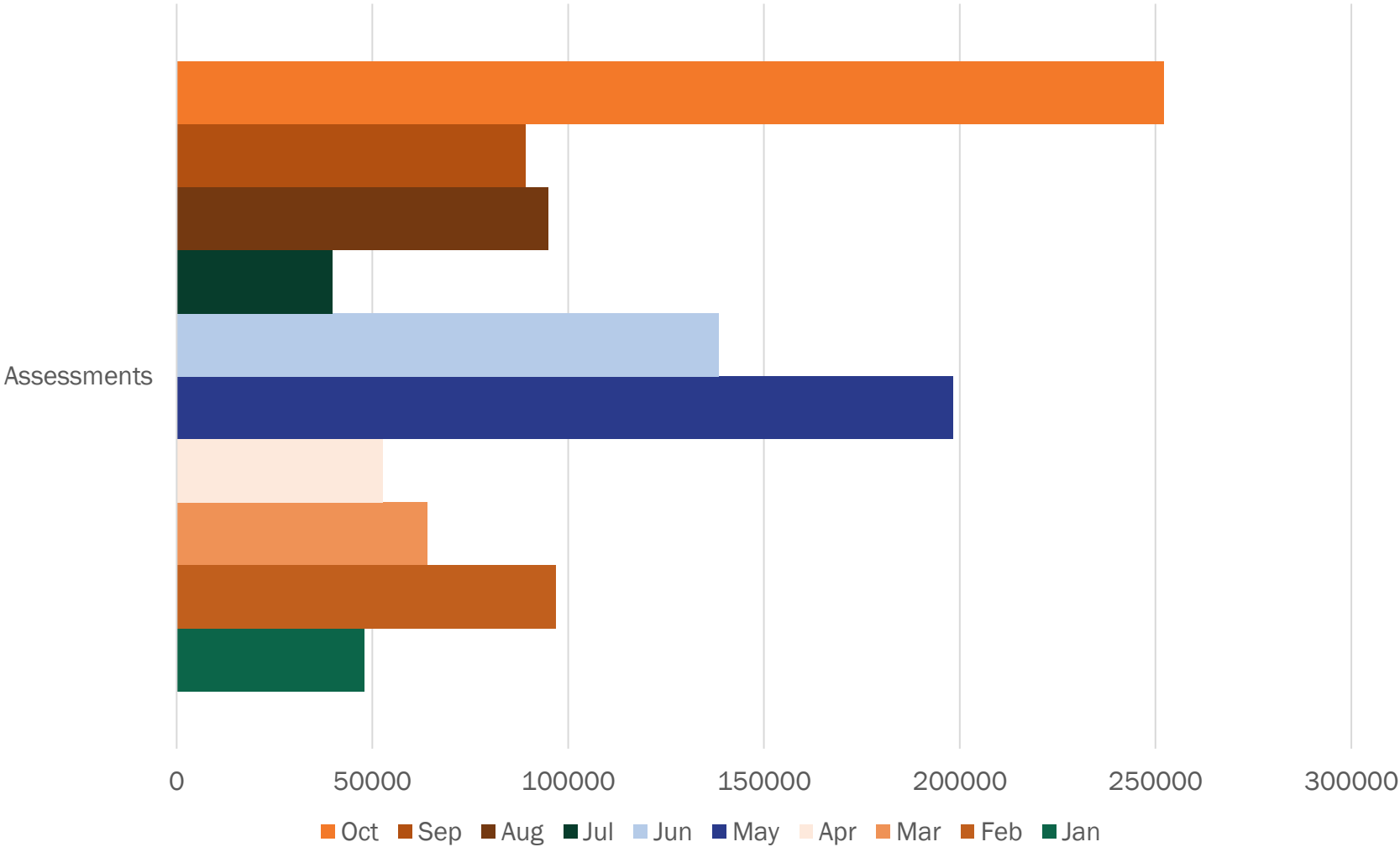
"If you ask me, a crime that will never end is worse than a crime that is over, no matter how much more serious it may appear."
