When young people are involved in decision making processes and in policy implementation, it doesn't just make our institutions more representative; it enriches their work, fosters trust, and helps break a cycle of growing disenchantment and disengagement.

The Council of Europe is playing its part, with the co-management mechanism of the Joint Council on Youth, and now also with the Youth Participation Mechanism of the Parliamentary Assembly.

I am confident that this new mechanism will allow the Assembly to integrate fresh energies and inspiration in its future work: while it will require additional efforts to function, it will also repay these efforts with new ideas, new perspectives, and new solutions.

I encourage you all to closely follow the work of the Assembly, and actively engage with the MPs from your countries, proposing potential discussion topics for the Assembly. Your contributions will be essential in making this mechanism effective.

To conclude, I believe that engaging and incorporating youth perspectives has a much deeper effect: it nurtures the next generation of political leaders – those who will uphold and advance our democracies in the years to come.
